NEW MACHINE RECORDS VOICE.

Will Receive and Give All Telephonic Communications.

A wonderful invention, complete and ready to put on the market, is on exhibition at Marsters' Drug Store. It is called the telephonograph, and is the invention of Valdimir Paulsen, of Denmark.

The machine is a combination of the telephone and the phonograph. The telephonic principle is entirely new. The record, instead of being tangibly made by the impression of a needle on wax, is made by means of magnetism on steel. The vibrations of speech, which, traveling over a wire and reproduced in a receiver, and which make the telephone possible, are in this case caught and held on to a steel plate by magnetism.

It is the discovery of the possibility of the localization of magnetism that made this possible. The result is that the phonographic record is not on the surface of the plate, but is a part of it, not to be eradicated even with a file. Once made, all that is necessary is that a conductor of magnetism should pass the plate and the vibrations of the voice are reproduced. The voice, thus heard, has much more of the human quality than in the phonograph. Every shade of expression, each note of feeling is reproduced. But all that is necessary to eradicate the spoken message from the record is to speak another message on top of it. The last message wipes out, as it were, the first one and records itself in the vacant place.

The distance at which this machine may be successfully operated is limited only by the same limitations that affect the telephone. Attached to the telephone, it is possible, with this machine, that when a man is out of his office, those calling him up may leave their message, speaking it into the phone just as if he were there. When the man comes back he can pick up his receiver and hear one or a dozen messages that may have been left during his absence.

PTOMAINE POISONING.

How to Prevent it in Meat, Fish and Crabs.

The reports of cases of ptomaine poisoning from eating crabs should be a warning to housekeepers and cooks as to all kinds of ptomaine dangers. A ptomaine is not a microbe, but is the product of a microbe, as all grain alcohol is the product of fermentation, caused by the yeast microbe, which changes sugar into alcohol. Alcohol itself is, therefore, a ptomaine, but as to its poisonous effects opinions will continue to differ. Vinegar is another ptomaine, the product of the microbe Mycoderma aceti. This ptomaine is not dangerous when properly used.

But there are many dangerous ptomaines, the products of various putrefactive microbes. The microbes themselves may always be killed by boiling, but ptomaines may not be so killed, as boiled alcohol is still alcohol. The only sure way, says the Baltimore American, to prevent ptomaine poisoning in meat, fish, crabs or any other article of diet is to kill the microbes and thus prevent the production of ptomaine.

Crabs are not healthy unless killed by severe and sudden heat, as by being thrown alive into boiling water. This practice appears to be cruel, but it is just the contrary, as the hot water causes the crab to lose consciousness instantly and its suffering ceases at once. And any crab killed by boiling water can be eaten with perfect safety.

If crabs are kept six hours after boiling, they should be boiled again for at least a few moments, after which they may be kept safely for another six hours. Then they should be boiled again, for the same reason as before, to prevent the production of ptomaine. It is not safe to keep crabs, fish, meat or any other cooked articles of food longer than six or eight hours without reboiling, even if kept on ice.

Ice retards the work of microbes but does not kill the microbe or stop its work. In fact, unless the greatest care is taken by the housekeeper, a ice chest may become a most dangerous incubator of microbes.

Water made boiling hot is man's best defense against his infinitesimal but often fatal enemy, since no microbe can survive contact with it.

OPENING A BOOK.

How to Handle a Volume Without Breaking its Back.

Hold the book with its back on a smooth or covered table. Let the front board down, then the other, holding the leaves in one hand while you open a few leaves at the back, then a few at the front, and so on, alternately opening back and front, gently pressing open the sections till you reach the center of the volume. Do this two or three times, and you will obtain the best results, says a writer in Modern Bookbinding. Open the volume violently or carelessly in any one place, and you will likely break the back and cause a start in the leaves. Never force the back of the book.

A connoisseur many years ago, an excellent customer of mine, who thought he knew perfectly how to handle books, came into my office when I had an expensive binding just brought from the bindery ready to be sent home. He before my eyes took hold of the volume and, lightly holding the leaves in each hand instead of allowing them free play, violently opened it in the center and exclaimed, "How beautifully your bindings open!" I almost fainted. He had broken the back of the volume, and it had to be reborn.

SHOOT THEM ON SIGHT.

Baker City Mayor Advises Citizens Regarding Firebugs.

BAKER CITY, Or., Oct. 8.—This city has been visited by a series of incendiary fires which threaten the property of the citizens to such an extent that there are special patrolmen employed and great effort is being made to locate or capture the firebugs.

Tuesday night there were three fires, one the old Paul residence, unoccupied, but a historic old building. It was furnished originally by Sloane, of New York. The loss was about \$5000.

A few minutes later two barns were burned and almost immediately after the old creamery property went up in smoke.

Yesterday and last night there were three more fires of incendiary origin. The matter became so serious that Mayor Johns issued last evening the following proclamation:

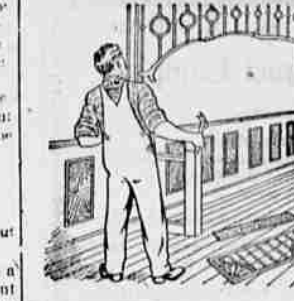
