OREGON WOOL OUTPUT.

Not as Large as in 1907—Price Not as Good as in 1906.

PORTLAND, Or., Oct. 11.—The Oregon wool season of 1908 is now drawing to a close with the purchasing of the remaining lots of the fall clip in the western and southern parts of the state. It is estimated by dealers that about \$19,000,000 of wool remain in growers' hands, of which 200,000 pounds are in eastern Oregon, 35,000 pounds in the Willamette Valley and 75,000 pounds in southern Oregon. There is a good market for these remnants now if the farmers are willing to part with them.

The total output of the state is estimated at 18,500,000 pounds, as compared with 20,000,000 pounds shown in 1907, and 18,000,000 pounds in 1906. The value of this year's clip is approximately \$2,500,000, compared with a total valuation of \$3,800,000 in 1907 and \$3,240,000 two years ago.

Prices paid this season ranged from 12 to 15 cents for good average to choice wool, and in some instances better than 16 cents was paid.
