BRYAN POLICIES ADOPTED.

By Republican Leaders, Shown by Former Senator Gearin.

PENDLETON, Or., Oct. 10.—Answering the attack of Governor Hughes on Mr. Bryan, as echoed by Senator Beveridge in Portland last Tuesday, Senator Gearin this evening at the courthouse showed that the Bryan policies, which were to work wreck and ruin to this country, had in most instances been the support of the republican platform in its apparent reading and in every instance the indorsement of the republicans.

Senator Gearin addressed the crowded courtroom for two hours and held intense interest throughout his discussion. The audience was composed mainly of working people and his references to the bank deposit guaranty were cheered to the echo by those whose savings had been tied up by the panic of the republican administration.

Mr. Gearin declared and showed that, from the utterances of the republican platform the only Bryan policy the republicans feared was the ghost of bimetallism, and he read the plank of the Oregon republican party in 1890, declaring unequivocally for free silver.

"When I appear at the mourners' bench," he declared, "I expect to be met first by Charles Fulton and next by Jonathan Bourne, leading a brass band and with both hands pounding the bass drum."

Almost every mention of Bryan's name was greeted with cheers. Thus far local democrats have manifested far more enthusiasm than the republicans.

day voted for extraordinary military appropriations, aggregating a total of \$3,000,000 to meet immediate demands for mobilizing the army and protecting the frontier. The following resolution was adopted:

"After hearing the government's explanation of the failure to declare war against Austria, parliament expects to exert the most vigorous activity to protect the threatened interests of the nation."

Despite active preparations for war, there is a quieter feeling among the populace today. This is due to the realization that Serbia is not prepared to fight Austria successfully.

Ferdinand Crowned.

SOFIA, Bulgaria, Oct. 12.—Amid a wild demonstration, Prince Ferdinand and his wife were today crowned Czar and Czarina of Bulgaria, which last week renounced Turkish domination and declared its independence. In view of England's threat to intervene, Turkey is not likely to declare war.

Game of Traveling.

Did you ever play a game called traveling? It is both instructive and amusing. The leader seats himself at the center of the ring and says, "I went to Philadelphia, where I saw a statue." Caring For the Eyes.

Never read with your head down. Always sit up as straight as possible. It is easy to find a comfortable position without leaning forward. If you lean forward, with your head hanging down or inclined forward, more blood will flow into your eyes than will be good for them. Don't read facing a light. Let the light come over one of your shoulders, preferably the left, because then the hands are never in the way of the light, either in reading or in writing. Never read in bed. Sooner or later that would seriously affect your sight. Besides, you should not go to bed until the time has come to go to sleep. Always stop reading when your eyes feel tired, especially at night.
