At the coroner's inquest held at Oakland Monday over the body of the young boy picked up under the railroad trestle north of that town, Sunday morning, the identity of the boy was not ascertained. The coroner's jury found that the boy was either thrown or fell from a running train, and no responsibility was fixed. Since the tragedy and the description of the boy has been given publicly in the Portland press, Coroner Jewett has received three different inquiries from parents of runaway boys in that city. In neither instance, however, did the description given tally with that of the dead boy. A fourth inquiry bears a description that tallies in some respects, and it may be that this will lead to the boy's identification. The body is still at Oakland awaiting a claimant, but if none appears by tomorrow it will be given burial near that town. Jackson and Murray, the youthful "hobos" who were with the dead boy but a few hours before the tragedy, and who were the principal witnesses at the inquest, are now in the custody of County Judge Wagoner in this city. Each of the boys is 16 years of age. They give Butte, Mont., as their home and explain that the poverty of their parents induced them to "hit" the road and look for work. Being non-residents of the state, they cannot be committed to the Oregon reform school and Judge Wagoner does not like to wire the impoverished parents for their transportation back home. As a solution to the problem, Judge Wagoner will try to find some light work for the lads.

SUNDAY CLOSING LAW.
Judge Gantenbein Decides That it is Unconstitutional.

PORTLAND, Or., Oct. 12.—That the Sunday closing law as provided by the state legislature is unconstitutional was the decision of Judge Gantenbein in the circuit court today. Judge Gantenbein held that the Sunday closing law was unconstitutional because the legislature had no right under the supreme law of the land to discriminate between occupations, and based that decision on the constitutional law which allows freedom in religion.
