ARMY OF CUMBERLAND.

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn., Oct. 14.—Coming this time on a mission of peace and amity, the "boys in blue" are today invading Chattanooga to visit for what may be the last time the scenes of the bloody clashes between the armies of the North and South, which took place near this city. The reunion is the official annual gathering of the Society of the Army of the Cumberland, and although the membership rolls of the body have been greatly diminished by death during the last year, many Yankee veterans who fought the "rebs" around Chattanooga are here, coming from all over the country.

The Confederate veterans of the city will assist informally in the entertainment of their one-time enemies and the citizens of Chattanooga have also assisted in the plans for making the stay of the "old boys" a pleasant one. Aside from the business sessions of the society, the visitors will go on excursions to Lookout Mountain, Mission Ridge, Sherman Heights and Orchard Knob. It was at the latter place that General Grant gave the fateful order for the advance of the Army of the Cumberland. Mission Ridge, rising 400 feet above the plain, is now dotted with beautiful houses and marked with many monuments and tablets showing the location of all the troops engaged in that memorable battle.

OREGON HAPPENINGS.

Mail Pouch Stolen.
THE DALLES, Oct. 13.—It has just been learned that a locked mail pouch was stolen here the night of October 8, from the mail cart at the O. R. & N. depot. The mail was taken from the postoffice to the depot by the O. R. & N. messenger. While he was in the depot, the cart and mail being outside, the locked pouch was stolen. The police officers were notified but no clue has been found. Fair was in progress here and the city was full of strangers.

Fatal Accident.
HILLSBORO, Oct. 13.—The three small sons of Mr. and Mrs. Charles George, living about 10 miles southwest of this city, were injured in a runaway accident Friday evening. The oldest boy, about 11 years, died Sunday night, and the youngest, 3 years, is in a critical condition, having lost one arm nearly torn out of its socket.

They were out with the team after a load of fodder. In the runaway the oldest boy fell upon the double-trees and was dragged head downward for about a mile and a quarter over rough ground before the team was stopped.

The other two were thrown out, but the second boy was not so badly hurt.

Overdose Kills Him.
CORVALLIS, Oct. 13.—"Jack" Morgan, employed at the Corvallis sawmill, died at the city jail early this morning from the effects of an overdose of medicine, taken in a small quantity of ether yesterday afternoon. He was recovering from an attack of delirium tremens.

NEW YORK, Oct. 13.—Unless a further delay is secured, Charles W. Morse and Alfred W. Curtis will be placed on trial in the United States circuit court tomorrow on a charge of conspiracy and misapplication of the funds of the National Bank of North America. Morse was vice-president of the bank up to the time of the financial crash last fall. Curtis was president.

Judge Hough of the United States court set this date and also fixed the same date for the beginning of the trial of F. Augustus Heinze, who was indicted on a charge of over-valuation of checks while president of the Mercantile National Bank.

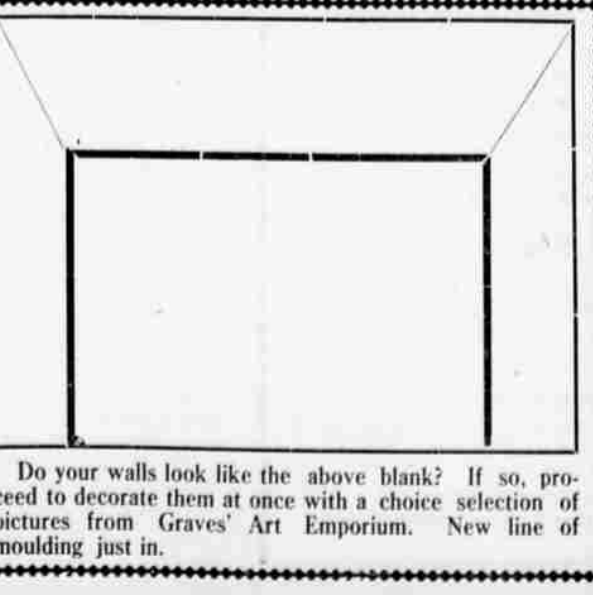
