### LINCOLN-DOUGLAS DEBATE

Fiftieth Anniversary Celebrated at Alton, Illinois.

ST. LOUIS, Oct. 15.—Thousands of St. Louisans are today participating in the celebration at Alton, Ill., of the semi-centennial anniversary of the last great history making debate between Abraham Lincoln and Stephen A. Douglas, "the little giant," which took place at that town on October 15, 1858. Lincoln and Douglas were opponents for the Illinois senatorship in that year, with the slavery question as the principal issue. The first of the series of debates, destined to become famous as the most remarkable political controversy in American history, was held at Ottawa on August 21. Six other debates followed at Freeport, Jonesboro, Galesburg, Quincy and Alton, and each of these cities has recently celebrated the semi-centennial, the program at Alton today completing the anniversary exercises.

Although he expressed his detestation of slavery in the historic debate at Alton 50 years ago, Lincoln did not deny its constitutionality. He believed that the extension of slavery should be prevented, that the institution should be confined to that part of the United States where it then existed until means could be devised for its ultimate extinction without despoiling the property rights of the slave-holders in the blacks.

His opponent, Stephen A. Douglas, was a native of Vermont, who had settled in Chicago. He had been on the Illinois Supreme Court bench. He had represented Illinois for two terms in the United States senate, and during his senatorship, in 1854, he introduced the Kansas-Nebraska bill, which repealed the Missouri Compromise of 1820. He was one of the most ardent debaters in the land, and no less a patriot, though the presidential bee had long buzzed in his bonnet. He was a candidate for re-election in 1858.

Lincoln's political career up to the beginning of the debates with Douglas was confined to six years in the Illinois legislature and one term in the lower house of Congress, to which office he was elected from Illinois in 1846. He did not

seek the office again, and was a somewhat obscure lawyer in Springfield, Ill., from 1849 to 1854, when he again entered the political arena because of his antagonism to the repeal of the Missouri Compromise.

Extension of slavery was the burning issue in politics in 1858, and the trend of northern opinion was against it. The "Little Giant" took a middle view of the situation. He believed that the people of a new territory or a state had the right to determine for themselves whether slavery should exist in any part of the United States.

Opposed to him was the virtually untried Lincoln.

When the campaign was over it was seen that a majority of Lincoln's supporters had been elected to the legislature, but the hold-over Democrats in that body added to the newly elected ones were numerically strong enough to elect Douglas.

#### ON TOTTERING LEGS.

Eugene V. Debs May Not be Able to Complete Red Special Tour.

NEW YORK, Oct. 14.—On tottering legs, but with a vigor in his voice that made his auditors forget that he is a sick man, Eugene V. Debs, Socialist candidate for president, spoke at two mass meetings on the East Side, the stronghold of the Socialist party in this city, last night, and also journeyed to Brooklyn to address a meeting.

So weak was the candidate that he had to be supported by two men as he spoke last night. His physicians say that unless Mr. Debs rests he will not be able to continue the schedule made out for the "red special" tour, which has now lasted 46 days and was planned to continue until the day before election.

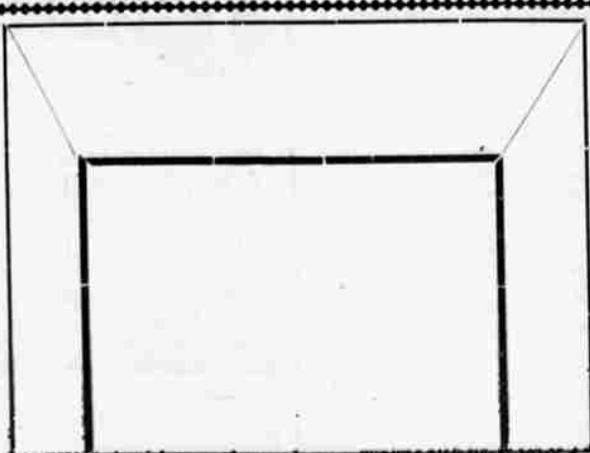
