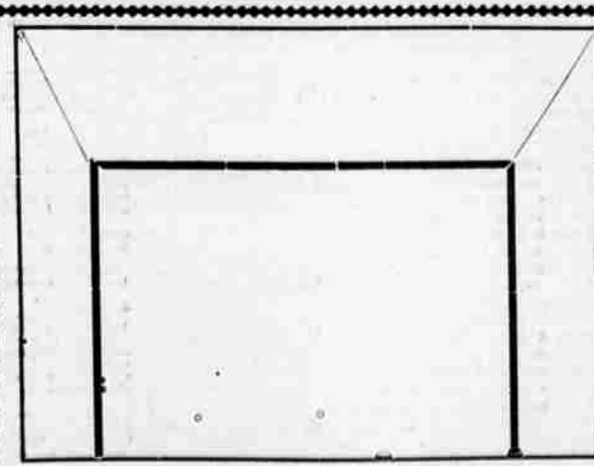

CANYONVILLE, Or., Oct. 17.—Borlino, the 13-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Bollenbaugh, living near here, while sitting in front of the fireplace this morning, was stricken with a spasm and fell forward into the fire.
