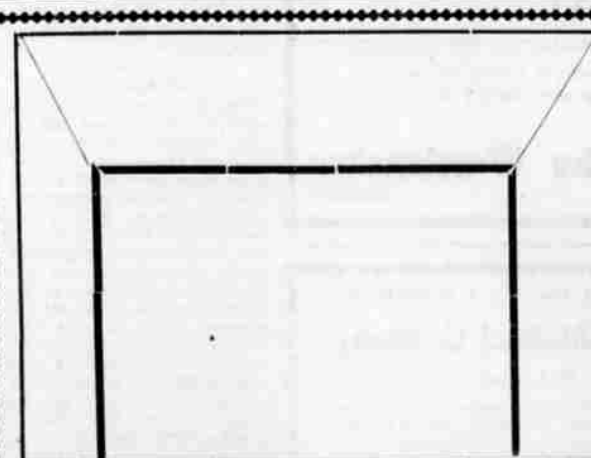

### C. A. GIBLER DEAD.

C. A. Gibler, a well known resident of this city, died at McNamara's, Linn county, last Saturday, Oct. 17, 1908, from the effects of a stroke of paralysis sustained on the preceding Thursday night. His wife was with him at the time of his death, she having left here Friday morning upon receipt of word by telephone informing her of Mr. Gibler's illness. The remains are expected to arrive here on the local train this evening. Mr. Gibler was about 55 years of age. During his 20 years' residence in Roseburg he followed alternately the trades of a mason, plasterer and shoemaker. Besides his wife, he is survived by two daughters and three sons. One of the former and one of the latter are children by his first wife. Mr. Gibler was a member of Umpqua Tribe, No. 14, Order of Redmen, of this city, and of Roseburg Assembly, No. 4, Lincoln Anniversary Union, in which he carried a life insurance policy of \$2.45. The funeral arrangements have not yet been made.

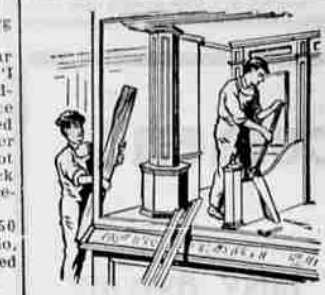
