Medford Tribune: E. J. Lewis, state organizer for the socialist party, was placed on trial before City Recorder Collins Monday morning for disorderly conduct on the streets of Medford Saturday evening, when he mixed up with Judge E. E. Kelly, who took exception to some remarks made by Lewis regarding lawyers as a class. A number of witnesses were placed on the stand. The court took the matter under advisement promising a decision at 4:30 o'clock Monday afternoon. Great interest was taken in the case, the courtroom being crowded. (Lewis lectured on the streets of Roseburg last week.)

### GAME TO THE LAST.

Fatally Wounded Game Warden Kills Four Indians.

MISSOULA, Mont., Oct. 19.—Mortally wounded in a battle with Flathead Indians who were resisting arrest for violation of the state game laws, C. B. Peyton, a deputy game warden, fired four shots from his rifle, and every shot killed an Indian. The encounter took place on Sunday afternoon at Hollands Prairie, on Swan River, near Ovanda, Powell county. The Indians were hunting without licenses and killing more deer than the law allows. Peyton and Herman Rudolph, another deputy game warden, learned of their offenses, and ordered the Indians to accompany them to Missoula.

The Indians refused to comply with the order, and when Peyton threatened to use force, four of the number ran off a short distance, turned quickly and at once commenced firing with their rifles. One of the rifle bullets struck Peyton in the breast and he fell bleeding to the ground. With supreme nerve, however, he rested his arm upon the ground and in rapid succession sent four shots after the murderers, every shot taking the life of an Indian.

**LOST HUNTER IS FOUND.** So Weak he Cannot Speak or Even Raise His Hand.

Medford Tribune: Oct. 19: So weakened by his long exposure to the weather and by his efforts to find his way to camp that he was unable to speak or even raise a hand, Herman Terrill, who was lost in the mountains on Morrison creek, last Saturday, was found by his two companions after they had given him up for dead. When found he was within two miles of camp, but so weakened that he could not even speak to his rescuers.

Boyd Terrill, brother of the unfortunate man, and John Mitchell, were the two who found the lost hunter after 48 hours of unceasing effort. They came upon him when they had almost lost all hope. He was lying in a ravine, unable to speak or move, so worn was he by exposure to the cold and rain which fell in torrents in the mountains. The two rescuers rubbed the body of the collapsed man until they got the blood into circulation and they then carried him two miles to camp, where he is recovering.

Terrill started hunting deer with two companions, both of whom returned camp and were awaiting the arrival of Terrill, when a home-steader near by came with the news that he had heard three shots fired in

rapid succession, the hunter's signal of distress. He had replied, but got no answer. The hunters immediately started to search for the lost man and succeeded in finding him only when they had given up all hope.

### GOES POISON ROUTE.

ALBANY, Or., Oct. 19.—Mrs. William Sawyer, of Brownville, was found in bed this morning by a neighbor in convulsions, caused through swallowing strychnine. She died at noon.

Mrs. Sawyer, who was 54 years old, came to Brownville a year ago from Tennessee to wed William Sawyer, a man much her senior, and a Colonel in the Union Army in the Civil war. Despondency over long illness is said to be the cause of her rash act.
