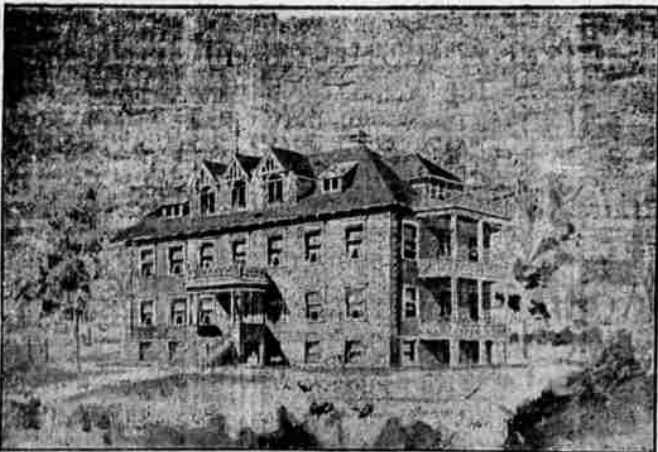

Deputy State Fish Warden Frank Brown, of Oregon City, and Warden Oldberg, a deputy at large, visited the Umpqua hatchery, east of this city, Saturday, and secured 300,000 Chinook salmon eggs, which will be shipped to Carson City, Nev., and there planted in Lake Tahoe.

S. S. Morrison has sued I. P. Gardner in the circuit court here for \$500, alleged to be due on an agreement whereby Gardner was to pay him \$100 for every person Gardner located on unsurveyed government land in township 28-3, east of Myrtle Creek, if he would establish the necessary temporary section corners. Morrison alleges that he made three surveys and that Gardner thereafter located six persons on claims within their boundaries, but that he only paid him \$100, whereas, he claims, he is entitled to \$500.

It is not believed, however, that Critser will seek to evade custody for any length of time, and no special effort is being put forth to hunt him. Dr. C. E. Bogue, also indicted on a charge of selling liquor, has furnished bail of \$300 to insure his appearance at the next term of court.
