C. B. Cannon and D. C. Pitzer, the local real estate men, have sold for H. A. Collins the Lambert Hotel at Oakland to a Mr. Lambert, of Grand Junction, Colo. The price paid was \$6350. Mr. Lambert will take charge of the hostelry immediately.

Through the agency of H. F. Deardorff, a number of progressive Oakland people have purchased an imported English hackney stallion of A. C. Ruby, of Portland, the leading horse importer of the state. The stallion is 4 years old, weighs 1325 pounds and brought a price of \$3000. The purchasers are Frank Hagan, George Hall, S. C. Quant, F. B. Waite, Cockeram Bros., J. M. Engle, and Ben Cook. They will shortly form a company. Their horse is the first of his strain to be acquired in Douglas county. This strain is recognized as the greatest in the world for saddle and roadster work. Oakland is to be congratulated upon the acquisition of this valuable animal, and the purchasers are to be commended for their enterprise. The stallion is one of the large shipment brought over from Europe by Mr. Ruby and Mr. Deardorff last summer. Thirty of these horses have been sold since August, four of them by Mr. Deardorff, who is devoting his entire time as a salesman for Mr. Ruby.

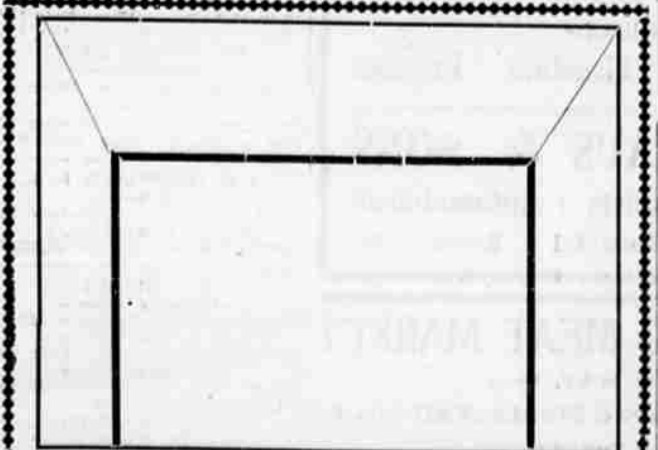
