Rufus Fish, the "hobo," charged with stealing a watch, knife and purse, belonging to Prof. George A. Crane, from the Tuesday schoolhouse near Wilbur last Tuesday night or Wednesday morning, was arraigned before Justice of the Peace Ed. Singleton at Wilbur, Monday, and held to the Circuit court for trial on a charge of larceny. His bail was fixed at \$100, in default of which he is now in the county jail. Fish was arrested in Roseburg last Tuesday at midnight by Policeman Palm. The stolen articles were found on Fish's person. This evidence is strengthened by the fact that the S. P. section boss at Wilbur and two of his crew testified at the hearing before Justice Singleton that they saw Fish in company with another "hobo" passing through Wilbur early Wednesday morning last. Fish's companion, who cannot be located, is believed to be in possession of another article stolen at the time of the robbery—a leather watch fob, to which was attached a German silver ornament.
