WATERWORKS BOND SALE.

Work Will Commence At Once on

Oakland Plant.

OAKLAND, Or., Nov. 10.—Mayor

Hunt has received a telegram

stating that the \$15,000 issue of water

bonds had been sold and that the

money was on deposit. The city

council has all plans matured for im-

mediate construction work on the

waterworks plant, and unless unfore-

seen delays are occasioned through

non-arrival of material, work will

be well under way by December 1st.
