**LAUNCH NEW DREADNOUGHT.**

Type of Battleship Being Adopted by Leading Naval Powers.

FORE RIVER, Mass., Nov. 10.—Uncle Sam's new Dreadnought, the North Dakota, a 20,000-ton fighting monster of the seas, was launched today at the yards of the Fore River Shipbuilding Company.

The North Dakota and the Delaware are almost precisely alike, each having a long forecastle deck extending from the bow almost to the center of the vessel. The ten twelve-inch guns are arranged in five turrets, two to a turret, the forward turret being so located that the axes of its guns are 24 feet above the water line. Just abaft this turret is another, the barbettes of which is of sufficient height for its guns to clear the roof of the forward turret. Aft the break of the forecastle deck, and also situated on the axis of the ship, are two more twelve-inch gun turrets, and abaft and near the stern is the fifth and last of the big turrets.

The wonderful speed of these big ships, 21 knots, makes every other battleship not turbine driven a tortoise-like affair. In an action a fleet of Dreadnoughts might accept or decline battle, as suited its convenience. It could also choose its own range and control the rate of change of range.

Although the tremendous power of concentration secured by the ten 12-inch guns of a Dreadnought is the principal reason for the adoption of this new type by all the navies of the world, its cost is much less than

four small battleships aggregating the same power. As to the question of maintenance, it costs no more to keep the big ship in commission than the small one. A million a year is about the expense of it. Strange as it may seem, it does not require as many officers to man it. Fewer men are necessary to serve the ten guns of one of our new Dreadnoughts than are required for all the guns of the Missouri.

In combat such ships would conquer without wasting a single shot. Secure in the possession of impregnable armor, one of them could descend on her adversaries and with the concentrated fire of her ten hard-hitting guns hammer the little ships to the point of surrender or speedy annihilation. Her perfect fire control would never permit a mis-sweeping shot across the sea. Sweeping the enemy in the crosswires of their sights, her ten enormous guns high above the waves' spray, would seek out the vulnerable point of the enemy and by continuous pounding would silence his heaviest guns.

Naval experts are now generally agreed that the Dreadnought type is the battleship of the future and that the nation with the largest and most efficient fleet of these monsters will control the world. Although late in getting into the game, Uncle Sam will find his two new ships a valuable addition to the navy, although many more will be necessary to cope with the great nations of Europe.

to be ready by 1911. This last stupendous effort to retain the supremacy will cost the Germans \$100,000,000.

In 1911 the grand flag of the Mikado will fly over seven Dreadnoughts and nine Dreadnought cruisers. At that date Uncle Sam will have four ships of the highest efficiency and two others of the Michigan type—a sort of Dreadnought compromise. Great Britain will add eight improved Dreadnoughts to her navy and four cruisers, each carrying eight 12-inch guns and with a speed of 24 knots. Italy has waked up and is building a 19,000-ton battleship. France, which once held second place among the world's naval powers, has dropped to fifth.

**SHORTHORN SPLENDOR.**

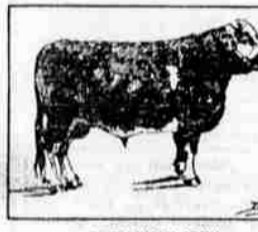
Breeders Round Out a Great Year on Both Sides of the Atlantic.

A progressive policy is being pursued by the American Shorthorn Breeders' association to procure the extension of the market for our Shorthorn cattle. Last fall, it will be remembered, the officers of the society undertook a personally conducted exportation of bulls and heifers into Mexico, and, while the financial results showed little or no gain, a fine lot of cattle were sold to individual breeders, whose example in purchasing will doubtless be followed by others.

During the trip it was borne in on the officials that if the effort should be followed up intelligently many more Shorthorns could be sold south of the Rio Grande, and to that end arrangements have been completed for the proper representation of the trade. L. Villarreal Madero, San Antonio, Tex., has been appointed agent of the association and has been conducting negotiations with the Mexican officials.

It is made plain that the officials of the American Shorthorn association made a most excellent move when they invaded Mexico with a lot of Short horn cattle. They have secured the active co-operation of the Mexican department of agriculture and also of the various state departments, which assist in time succeed in opening up a fruitful demand for our cattle. It is work of this kind that counts.

At Smithfield. Shorthorn breeders have rounded out a great year on both sides of the Atlantic. A calf of that breed was champion at the International, and now the returns from Smithfield bring news of a sweeping victory for the "red, white and roan." Peter Dunn's steer Gentle-

man John was grand champion of the show, Sir Oswald Mosley's big red and white steer was adjudged the best steer in the show, and King Edward's white steer was made the champion under two years of age.

An award practically without parallel gave the purple ribbon to Gentleman John. He was only second in his class and reserve for the steer championship, but in the final roundup he was made the grand champion, with Earl Roseburg's Angus heifer Eloquence of Dalmy reserve. The latter heifer was the champion female and also won the King's Challenge cup for the best animal bred by the exhibitor. It thus appears that all the most important championships were won by pure bred cattle.—Breeder's Gazette, Chicago.
