ASSAULTERS ARE SENTENCED. EUGENE, Or., Nov. 11.—Robert Harvey and Harry Murphy, recently slumped in business, at M. V. DeWald, at Cottage Grove, were sentenced today to nine years each in the penitentiary, by Judge L. T. Harris.

BIG SAWMILL RESUMES. The future development of the lumber industry in this country lies in the direction of a closer utilization of forest products. Both foresters and practical lumbermen now agree on this point.

Just what can be done in this field is well illustrated in the operations at the mill of the Great Southern Lumber Company, which has just reopened its plant at Bogalusa, Louisiana, in response to the increased demand for lumber after the recent slump in business. This is perhaps the largest sawmill in the United States, if not in the world, and is capable of turning out the enormous amount of 600,000 feet of sawn lumber board measure per day. A reader can get a fair idea of this quantity of lumber when he is told that its output is enough to build a little town of 40 houses, along with a good-sized church and a school house every day.

This company was quick to grasp the significance of the rapid depletion of timber resources. Last year it began a co-operative investigation in wood utilization with the United States Forest Service and arrangements have just been completed for a renewal of the experiments. The work will be along practical lines and will be aimed to secure a closer utilization of the products of the southern lumber mills and at the same time produce a margin of profit in excess of that obtained by the methods which are now practiced.

PREMONITION CORRECT.

Girl Digs and Discovers Buried Body of Murdered Brother.

MARENGO, Ill., Nov. 11.—Haunted night and day by a premonition that her brother had been brutally murdered and then buried—a fear that robbed her of sleep for two weeks, and during her waking hours drove her to the verge of insanity, Arvilla Hoganson, the 12-year-old sister of O. Hoganson, took a shovel and frantically threw up the earth in a spot where her premonition had taken her and finally, exhausted, drove the blade into the body of her brother.

The girl made her gruesome discovery in the poultry yard on the John Bedford farm, which adjoins the Hoganson place. Hoganson disappeared two weeks ago. Bedford was arrested in Nebraska and charged with murder. Today the sheriff and a force of workmen began digging in the chicken lot in search of further evidence against the man under arrest. It is the belief of the authorities that many bodies will be found buried on the Bedford farm and in the vicinity, and that a series of murders similar to the Guinness case will be brought to light.
