DOWAGER EMPRESS DEAD.

China to Mourn for 100 Days—Court Mourns for Three Years.

PEKIN, Nov. 15.—Tze Hsi An, the Dowager Empress of China, autocratic head of the government, which she had directed without successful interference since 1861, and without protest since 1881, died this afternoon.

The announcement of the Dowager Empress' death was official and followed closely upon the announcement that Kwang Hsu, the Emperor, had died yesterday in the afternoon. An edict issued this morning placed upon the throne Prince Pu Yi, the 3-year-old son of Prince Chun, the Regent of the Empire, in accordance with a promise given by the Dowager Empress soon after the marriage of Prince Chun in 1903. An edict issued Friday made Prince Pu Yi their presumptive.

Prince Chun, the Regent, has ordered a hundred days of mourning. The court will go into mourning for three years.

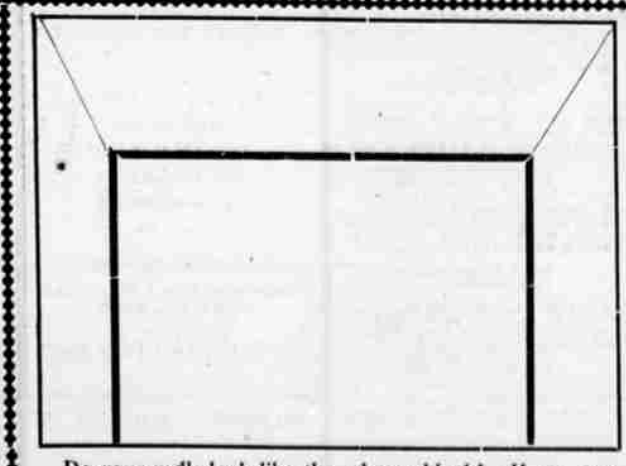
