### BY WAY OF MYRTLE POINT.

Marshfield Again Imagines It Wants Electric Line to Aoseburg.

MARSHFIELD, Or., Nov. 15—Coos Bay people have not given up the idea of building an electric line from Marshfield to Roseburg. Such a plan was brought forward a year or so ago and Douglas county men subscribed \$125,000, if Coos Bay would put up a like amount. The plans fell through, however. Now there is serious discussion of such a scheme, and Coos Bay business men believe that a movement in that direction should again be made.

It is thought that if \$500,000 was raised it would build 20 miles of the road, and that money for the rest of the construction could easily be obtained by bonding. The road from Myrtle Point to Roseburg, which is now under way, is the one which would cost less for construction and at the same time tap a more valuable farming country than would be found on the Coos Bay wagon road.
