The heaviest fine yet imposed by Recorder Orcutt in a case of drunkenness and disorderly conduct was meted out in his court Monday afternoon to Ralph Kitchin, who occupied his time in jail last Saturday night by wrecking an iron door with a 60-pound iron ball. The amount of the fine was \$40, or \$10 less than the maximum prescribed by law. Kitchin paid the amount and was discharged from custody. The incident was commented upon by Mayor Hoover during the council meeting Monday night. He suggested that city policemen be instructed to confine drunkards or other prisoners inclined to violence in the inner cells of the jail until such time as their condition warranted them being allowed in the corridor. Marshal Hansbrough assumed responsibility for the affair in question, explaining that it was due to his lack of acquaintance with the jail prisoners. He was not familiar with locks on the inner cells, he said, neither was he aware of the presence of the big iron ball in the corridor. This statement closed the incident.
