THANKSGIVING IN NEW YORK.

Rich and Poor Alike and Even Those Imprisoned Will Eat Turkey.
 NEW YORK, Nov. 25.—In the mansions on Fifth avenue, in the more modest homes in Harlem, Brooklyn and the Bronx, in the tenements of the East Side, in the refuges where charity spreads the board, and even in the jails and prisons, Thanksgiving Day will be observed tomorrow with all the joy and jollity which always characterizes the holiday in the metropolis. As usual, business will be generally suspended and the millions of New York citizens will exude the Thanksgiving spirit and absorb the Thanksgiving turkey and other delicacies.
 As usual, the Salvation Army will provide a great dinner for thousands in several places in Manhattan and Brooklyn. Army officials estimate that a quarter of a million people will be rendered happy by free dinners from all sources. Thousands of families will receive baskets of food from the Army and other charitable organizations and individuals.
 Even in the grim prisons at Blackwell's Island and Sing Sing the prisoners will have the holiday and be given a feast which will include turkey, cranberry sauce and mince pie. All the immigrants at Ellis Island will also have a great feast which is likely to confirm their opinion that America is the land of luxury for all.
 There will be the annual dinner for the "newbies" in the New York City Home in Chambers street. The feast serves to keep green in the hearts of the lads the memory of their benefactor, Mrs. William Waldorf Astor, who provided for it in her will. Each boy will get a pound of turkey, a whole mince pie and a plentiful supply of celery, potatoes, chauterries, bread and butter and tea, coffee or milk.

TURKEY 30 CENTS A POUND.

PORTLAND, Or., Nov. 25.—Some one in Portland may have to go without turkey this Thanksgiving. The supply, as was feared, proved small for the growing trade of the city, and high—27 1/2 to 29 cents a pound, at retail—but, judging from the way business was booming at the markets yesterday, Portlanders do not begrudge paying this steep price for the rosy bird.
 The Oregon turkey crop this year was the largest ever produced, but the supply available for the Thanksgiving trade was reduced by the purchase several weeks ago of over 3000 turkeys by the government for the use of the troops in the Philippines. That left just about the same quantity available for Portland as was on hand last year. The demand, however, is much stronger this year.
