BUSINESS MAN'S POINT OF VIEW

F. F. Ingram, of Detroit, writing in the December American Magazine, says:
"The so-called better class business men and professional men are interested in reformatory matters more than would seem from their actions. Marzani said 'How cowardly is the tendency when men accumulate a little property or acquire social position. Their timidity prevents them from openly participating in progressive matters when their sympathies are that way.' That was illustrated in my personal experience in our Constitutional Convention this year." I was elected without a campaign or without effort, on the democratic ticket, in a district so overwhelmingly republican that the democrats seldom made a nomination. This shows party lines were not observed, but irrespective of party affiliations men voted for me because I have been bold and outspoken. During the four months' session I was continually reminded of the sympathy and support of such citizens, though when the citizens were called upon to come out in the open and support me or the measure I supported I was met by explanations or excuses.
"Business men are few who are directly benefitted by the dominance of corporations in governmental matters, but because the corporations seem to be all powerful in government they are reluctant about arousing their displeasure. The same applies to professional men. Probably not five per cent of the lawyers and doctors are direct beneficiaries of the corporations, but 95 per cent of them expect to be. So it is expectation or their part and timidity on the part of the business men that keeps them silent.
"Just the same they are interested in progress and reform. They want to read about it, they want education. Their moral courage should be stimulated where it exists and developed where it does not exist. This can be done by magazines like yours. There should be no hysterics, but sober literature. I feel sure there is an immense clientele for such literature. It may take some time for recognition, but recognition will come.
"I consider Miss Tarbell, Mr. Steffens and Mr. Baker in a class by themselves. There is no competition. Mr. Steffens in his late articles is hinting at the remedy. The remedy to restore the rule of the people. The people are ready to listen to it. This is evidenced by the agony of the special interests all over the United States in their efforts to prevent the enactment of direct legislation measures."

HINDUS PLOTTING MUTINY.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Nov. 25.—That the Hindus and Mohammedans in India have laid aside their prejudices and united in a gigantic conspiracy to wipe out British rule in that country in one bloody stroke is the sensational story which is told by Miss Helen A. Wilcox, an American missionary who returned from the Orient on the steamer Mongolia. Miss Wilcox says the manufacture of bombs by the revolutionists is a well known fact, the women being as active in making the infernal machines as are the men. Wholesale arrests have been made by the English authorities, but the purpose of the natives is not broken.
Miss Wilcox says that for a while every English resident in India feared assassination, dynamite outrages being of almost daily occurrence. But, she says, the natives are now thinking of wider ranges of activity and have decided that it will be easier to wipe out the British race in India in one swoop instead of wasting time on petty outrages.
