Hardin Davis, one of Douglas county's earliest pioneers, has sold his farm beyond Wilbur and moved to this city to reside. He settled on his donation land claim there in October, 1853, and made that his home ever since. He had gradually added to his holdings, however, until the farm which he sold aggregated 260 acres. The purchaser is Jasper Eccles and his father, of Penawawa, Wash., the former being a brother-in-law of John Gross, of Lower Calapooia. The price is not stated but it is understood to be at about 25 per cent advance over the figure at which Mr. Davis offered the farm a year ago. After 55 years of constant attention to the farm Mr. Davis now retires from active labor and has leased property in The Grove, in this city.

Cottage Grove, Western Oregon: Born, to Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Chapman, of Divide, on Friday last, a son, Portland Oregonian, Dec. 1: The trial of Louis Kohlhaugen, charged with perjury, began yesterday afternoon before Judge Wolverton. Kohlhaugen is charged by the government with having sworn falsely when he filed on a timber claim that at the time of filing was occupied as a homestead by A. H. Jones. Only a few witnesses are to be heard on both sides. The first witness called by the government was the register of the land office at Roseburg, B. L. Eddy. He was followed by Jones, himself. Register Eddy told of the rush that settlers made at the land office on April last, when the lands were thrown open for entry and said that a line was formed at least ten days before the date of throwing open the lands.

Frank Laird, who claims to be 18 years of age, but who looks younger, was arrested by Sheriff Penton, near Weston, 20 miles west of here, Tuesday, and brought to Roseburg and locked up in the county jail to await a hearing before Judge Wagoner, in the Juvenile Court, tomorrow.

Laird is accused of entering a school house at Weston last Sunday and committing an unprintable act, besides shooting holes through the stove pipe with a revolver. Two other boys, Otto Epps, aged 15, and

Hardman, aged about 20, are alleged to have participated in the affair, and may be arrested also, this depending on the statement that Laird will make. Laird and Epps ran away from their home in Bandon, Coos county, about six weeks ago, going to Brewster Valley and camping near Bert Campbell's place. They managed to eke out an existence by hunting and trapping. Hardman lives near Weston with his parents.
