The legal battle waged before Judge J. W. Hamilton in the circuit court, Friday, between Ada V. May and H. D. May for the possession of their 9-year-old son, Delbert, resulted in a victory, for the time being at least, for the woman. Judge Hamilton held as valid and binding the agreement between the contestants, at the time they were divorced at Dayton, Wash., to the effect that each was to have the custody of the boy for alternating periods of 3 months. He therefore awarded the woman the custody of the boy, and the two, together with a younger child, left this afternoon for Dayton. According to the time that has elapsed, however, the woman has only three weeks of her allotted time to keep the boy, after which he will return to his father to remain six months. Through his attorneys, May has filed notice of appeal to the supreme court.
