THE DAIRYMAN.

Many farmers have good cows and do not know it because they have fed just enough to get a poor yield. Do not condemn the cow until she has had an opportunity to show herself on a few months of liberal feeding.

For Swellings on Cows.

An excellent liniment for all kinds of swellings on dairy cows as well as on other farm animals is made of equal parts of turpentine, sweet oil and spirits of camphor. Apply liberally and frequently to the swollen parts.

Cleaning Dairy Utensils.

Sal soda is excellent for removing fat and disease from milk pails, cans and separators, but soap is best for dirt alone. Sal soda is neither poisonous nor corrosive. Use with water in small proportions.

Cheesy Butter.

The cheesy taste of butter is due to lack of thoroughness in washing and removing the buttermilk. Butter will not keep well if any of the buttermilk remains.

Packing the Silage.

Some men will not let the hired man work in the silo at filling time. They claim that the importance of thorough packing is so great that they cannot afford to trust it to any hired man. It is true that a slight error or a little carelessness inside the silo will make a great difference in the quality of the silage that comes out in the winter. The air must be completely excluded if decomposition is to be prevented. Unless the silage is thoroughly packed around the edges and, in fact, all through the silo there is sure to be loss.

Improved Butter Making.

An English authority on butter making claims that adding one pound of salt to every gallon of cream immediately after it is taken off the milk aids in ripening the cream and gives from 15 to 20 per cent more butter than cream that has no salt in it. The buttermilk is of course useless, as it cannot be fed to stock when it contains so much salt, but its loss is more than made up by the large quantity and better quality of butter. It is claimed.

WHAT CRUISE DID

Strengthened Bonds of Peace With Other Nations

ACQUAINTANCE BROADENED

Secretary of Navy, in Annual Report, Asks Congress to Construct 4 More Battleships

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 11.—Secretary Metcalf, of the Navy department, in his annual report, made public today, discusses, as the most notable naval event of the past year, the voyage of the battle-ship fleet, which "has proven an epoch-making cruise."

Late in the spring of 1907 it was decided to send the Atlantic fleet on a practice cruise to the Pacific. When the purpose of giving this assemblage of 16 battleships such a practice cruise, under severe conditions, was announced, he states, criticism from high technical quarters was heard. The undertaking, it was said, was too monumental; dangers more than multiplied with numbers in such a case; battleships should not be sent around the globe on any ordinary occasion; the skeletons of some of them would doubtless be left in the Straits of Magellan; and if the ships should round South America, they would, one by one, arrive with machineries loose and unserviceable, and with crews reflecting the condition of the material.

The facts are, Secretary Metcalf says, that the ships maintained schedule time, and have practically taken care of their own repairs on this cruise. The repairs list sent in at the naval station, Cavite, P. I., have just been received, and are insignificant. They show that after the voyage to the distant borders of the Pacific, the needed repairs are negligible. The performance of the Oregon in 1898 has, it seems, thus

been substantially repeated.

This cruise, as yet hardly half over, he declares has given us an opportunity to get better acquainted with the republics to the south of us, with our own island possessions, with the new and vigorous branch of the British Empire in Australia, and particularly with Japan; and has given those countries a better opportunity to get acquainted with us. It has been everywhere understood and accepted, as it was intended, as the reaching out of a strong hand in friendly greeting on the part of America, and the cordial hospitalities extended to our fleet will be long remembered, and have powerfully influenced feeling in this country. Between the United States and every country visited there is a feeling of deeper interest and friendship than existed before the fleet sailed.

Markamanship, he says, has improved on the practice cruise. With respect to the assertion that our 12-inch guns are inferior to those of other powers, the facts are found to be that the actual muzzle energy of these 12-inch guns, which form the main armament of our eight latest battleships in commission, is somewhat greater than that of any gun afloat in any other navy.

As the officer in command of the American fleet now in the Far East holds the rank of rear admiral only, he is in a position of subordination to foreign naval officers. This is true because foreign powers have, on important naval stations, representatives of the rank of vice-admiral.

The Secretary urges that the navy should, without delay, be provided with two vice admirals.

It is deemed highly desirable to acquire by purchase or to construct a dock in San Francisco Harbor. With the acquisition of such a dock, and the bringing up of higher efficiency of the yards at Bremerton and Mare Island, another navy-yard on the Pacific coast will not be necessary for some time to come.

The Secretary recommends that Congress authorize at its approaching session the construction of 4 battleships, 10 destroyers, 4 submarines, 2 colliers, 1 repair ship, 1 ammunition ship, 2 mine-laying ships—these two ships to be converted from cruisers now on the navy list.
