MRS. DORA MONHEIM DEAD.

Simon Caro, the local merchant, this afternoon received the sad news of the death today in Portland of his sister, Mrs. Dora Monheim, who for several years was a resident of Roseburg and is well remembered here. Mrs. Monheim was 60 years of age. Her death was due to paralysis, and it leaves Mr. Caro the sole surviving member of a family of five children. Mr. Caro will attend the funeral, which will be held in Portland next Sunday morning.

Mrs. Monheim was twice married. Her first husband, Joseph by name, died in Germany. Her second husband, C. Monheim, died in Portland about 19 years ago. She leaves two daughters, Mrs. Amelia Backman and Miss Belle Joseph, a school teacher, both living in Portland.

Mrs. Monheim (then Joseph) and her two daughters came to Roseburg from Germany in 1881, and made their home with Mr. Caro and his

family. In 1890 they moved to Portland. Mrs. Monheim enjoyed a wide acquaintance during her residence here, and the news of her death is received with deep regret.

MAKE HAUL OF \$750.

Burglars Blow Safe and Rob Store in Peoria, Linn County.

ALBANY, Or., Dec. 16.—Descending on the little village of Peoria, last night, two burglars made a haul worth about \$750, and have apparently made good their escape. They broke into the general merchandise store of U. G. Berry, the only store in Peoria, looted the store of everything of value that could be conveniently carried, and also blew open the safe. This contained more than \$250 in money and this and at least \$500 worth of stock was taken. There is no clue to the identity of the burglars. Peoria is a village on the Willamette River, in the western part of Linn County, six miles west of Shedd, the nearest railroad point. Being off the railroad, it is never frequented by criminals or even hoboes and this leads to the belief that two experienced criminals selected it.
