OREGON-IDAHO CONGRESS.

VALE, Or., Dec. 17.—The vast possibilities of the inland Empire of Oregon, touching from Vale to Coos Bay and from the O. R. & N. railroad on the north to the Southern Pacific on the south, constituted the scene of the oration of today's session of the Oregon-Idaho Development Congress.

In the evening, Dr. W. C. McClure dealt with the livestock industry, at present the principal business of the country. About 150 delegates from the two states were in attendance when the session opened.

Enthusiasm in the cause of development is marked. The principal project being boosted is the government Malheur Irrigation scheme.

H. D. HUMES WILL BE CONTESTED BY WIDOW.

Five-Sixths of Estate Parcelled Out. According to Report—Wife to Demand One-Third.

WEDDERBURN, Or., Dec. 17.—The last will and testament of the late H. D. Hume, the "Hume River salmon king," will be filed for probate at Gold Beach this week.

According to the report, Mrs. Hume, the widow, is cut off with what amounts to about one-sixth of the property. It is understood that Mrs. Hume has retained J. S. Cook, of Marshfield, to represent her and to contest the will.

The remaining five-sixths of the property is parcelled out among many relatives of the deceased with a few bequests for philanthropic purposes, one of which is said to be for the purpose of advancing the salmon and fishing industry by enabling the necessary research and study in this direction.

The will, according to the understanding here, will mean the breaking up of the immense estate, which is valued near the million-dollar mark. The estate is the foundation of one of the most valuable properties in Oregon if it could be preserved intact.

If the will is contested, report here has it that an effort will be made to show that Mr. Hume wanted to make a new will or change the old one during his last illness. He is said to have expressed the wish several times shortly prior to his death, but parties in attendance told him that if he changed the will, it might mean that it would be set aside as the courts would probably hold that he was not rational when he made the changes.

KINNICUTT LEAVES COON COUNTY; ROSE ON TRIAL.

Boy Charged With Assaulting Myrtle Point Girl Forfeits Bond of Five Hundred.

COQUILLE, Or., Dec. 17.—Tom Kinnicutt, one of the young men charged with an assault upon a Myrtle Point girl, has left the county. It is supposed, the young man was taken before Judge Hall presiding in the juvenile court, and after the evidence was heard, the judge declared him guilty.

As Kinnicutt was under age he could only be sent to the reform school from that court. Judge Hall thought that the charge was such a serious one that reform school punishment was not adequate and he bound the young man over to await the action of the grand jury which body could take further action. Bond in the sum of \$500 was furnished, but Kinnicutt did not appear and his bond will be forfeited.

Rose, one of the young men associated with Kinnicutt in the case, is now on trial in the circuit court.
