In 1908 the trees bore fruit of an inferior variety and plaintiffs were compelled to dig up the trees or graft them. Therefore by reason of defendants' misrepresentation in regard to the variety of trees and because of the four years' labor lost, plaintiffs feel damaged in the sum of \$2072.90.

\$34,000 FOR 85 ACRES.

GRANTS PASS, Or., Dec. 25.—A big real estate transaction was the purchase this week of Elsmann Bros. ranch, five miles west of Grants Pass, by Elmer Shank and C. C. Hall. The price paid was \$34,000 for 85 acres of land. Thirty-five acres are planted in Spitzenberg and Newtown apples, and it is one of the oldest orchards in the county. This 35-acre orchard yielded a \$17,000 crop in 1906. The ranch has complete equipment for taking care of the apple crop from the time of blossoming down to the shipping of the packed fruit.

DRAIN'S LOOK INTO FUTURE.
