A fact that is probably known by most housewives, but often ignored in practice, is the need of leaving milk uncovered until it is thoroughly cooled. Putting a tight cover on a pail of warm milk which at the time seems to be as sweet and nice as can be somehow develops a brood of unpleasant odors which it seems impossible to account for on any rational basis. It only needs to be remembered that exposure to fresh air and cooling are a source of purifying with milk and in some way enable it to maintain a decent reputation.

12-mill tax, if necessary, for the proper maintenance and advancement of the schools.
The 10-mill levy will raise enough funds, together with the county and state allotments, to wipe out about two-thirds of the deficit after all other expenses are paid.
After the levy was voted, a discussion arose over the price of \$1,200 asked by the Cobb Real Estate Co. for the proposed building site in the Waite addition. The price asked by Mr. Bellows and Mr. Barzee for their properties were considered decidedly reasonable, but there was a different opinion regarding the Waite Addition tract. Al Creason, one of the heavy taxpayers present, declared emphatically that the price asked is "exorbitant," and that the owners couldn't sell it to anybody else for anywhere near \$1200. This view was also shared by others present. Mr. Barzee, who is a member of the school board, explained, however, that the board was not compelled to pay such a price simply because it had been authorized to do so by the vote of the meeting. He said that the board would make a careful investigation of the matter before investing any money, and that if it considered \$1200 too high a price for the land the board would not pay it. This was satisfactory to the objectors, and the meeting was then adjourned.
