#### WHAT STREET PAVING DOES.

Eugene Guard: A deal was completed today whereby F. L. Chambers sold the corner lot at Sixth and Williamette Streets to Hampton Bros., the dry good merchants, for \$18,000. The lot faces on Williamette street, 75 feet, and extends back to the alley, a distance of 160 feet. The sale was engineered by E. J. Frazier, the real estate dealer. Hampton Bros. announce that they will erect a handsome three or four-story brick and stone building cover the entire lot, and will occupy every floor with a big department store.  
This is considered one of the very best business lots in the city, situated as it is across the street from the government postoffice site and being in a central location. Mr. Chambers bought the entire 160 feet frontage four years ago from the Lauer heirs for \$4200. This included the beautiful Lauer residence, which Mr. Chambers moved off last year. Since purchasing the property he has built a two-story brick block on the south side of the lot and still has 85 feet frontage left, selling less than half of the property for over four times what he paid for the entire quarter block.
