### ROSEBURG IN 1909.

Property of the City of Roseburg will be levied the least tax they experienced. For road, city school purposes there will be levied from 32 to 40 cents as those fixed in 1907. The levy is the only one that remains to be done when the court meets next month. It is estimated by one member that the levy will not be 8 mills, but that in all it will be 10 mills.

The city school district has each of 10 mills, and the county and state levies, accepted in advance as a total of 30 mills must be added, however, voted by the voters, conforming to the sundaries, into which it is divided. Three of these are Roseburg, Deer Creek and the city of Roseburg, each voting for property owners districts, while the Green voted 5 mills, making a total of 35 mills for the locality.

### ONE BOARD OF REGENTS FOR ALL STATE SCHOOLS

SALEM, Or., Dec. 30.—A bill has been prepared and will be introduced in the next legislature to place all the educational institutions of the state under a single board of regents. If such a law is enacted it will mean that the same board of regents will have jurisdiction over the affairs of the normal schools, the agricultural college and the University of Oregon. The measure will probably be introduced by Representative Libby, of Marion county.

The principal argument advanced by those who favor such a plan is one of economy. It is argued that a single board of regents of not more than five members, carefully selected as to their qualifications, each directing a certain department after the cabinet plan, will save more to the state within a year than possibly any other reform. There would be a uniformity in conducting the schools, and a system that would evolve a great number of now unforeseen advantages.
