AMERICANS SPEEDY.

Go Killing Pace More Feverishly Than Any Race, Says Rev. Dr. Aked.

TITLE FOR NEGRO FIGHTER.

Jack Johnson, the First Colored World's Heavyweight Champion. Tommy Burns, the Canadian heavy-weight, who was defeated recently in Australia by Jack Johnson, the Texan negro, says he is satisfied that he was beaten fairly.

When the fight had gone fourteen rounds the police stopped the bout. Johnson was declared the winner on points.

Jack Johnson is the first negro who ever won the world's heavy-weight pugilistic championship. In fact, he is the only negro who ever was permitted to battle for the honor. He was born in Galveston, Tex. In 1878 and began his ring career in 1901. He is six feet one and three-quarter inches in height and weighed at the ringside close to 160 pounds.

Burns was born in Hanover, Ont., in 1881 and started fighting when he was nineteen years old. He is five feet seven and one-quarter inches in height and weighs when trained for battle about 175 pounds.
