W. W. Wambold, a Civil War veteran, was received at the Soldiers' Home this morning from Woodburn. He is very feeble and will be taken care of at the hospital.

The Williams Bros. Door & Lumber Co., of Grants Pass, have sued the Victory Plaster Mining Co. for \$286.60 on a bill of goods sold between October, 1906, and November, 1907.

Emory Davidson arrived here this morning from Portland to visit with his mother and with his wife's parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Winston. Mrs. Davidson has been visiting here for several days past.

Petition for final papers of naturalization was filed with County Clerk Lenox today by Johan Ludwig Anderson, a native of Sweden. Declaration of intention to become a citizen was made by Anderson in Michigan in 1900. He is a resident of Woolley and a farmer by occupation.

Weather Observer Bell reports the rainfall for the 24 hours ending at five o'clock this morning as follows: San Francisco, .86 inch; Sacramento, .80; Red Bluff, .46; Roseburg, .46; Portland, .56. Snow was falling at Seattle, Walla Walla and Spokane. At Calgary the temperature was 32 degrees below zero; at Nome 6 above.

Fred J. Blakeley returned this morning from a business trip to Pittsburg and other eastern cities. He says "things look good for the west." Surplus money in the financial centers is being moved this way for securities of an agricultural character, and the immigration from the east this year will be almost wholly made up of people with capital seeking land, instead of prospective homesteaders, for whom there are no longer any great opportunities.

Jas. N. Randle, of Eugene, was here Thursday and Friday, demonstrating the Black Motor Vehicle (automobile). Just purchased by Dr. E. V. Hoover. This machine is equipped with wheels the same size as buggy wheels and these may have either hard rubber or steel tires, so it can be easily operated on muddy roads. This vehicle is known as a 12-horse-power runabout, designated as No. 12 in their catalogues. They range in price from \$375 to \$900, and are equipped with one, two or three seats, according to price and model. The machine shown here by Mr. Randle was given a thorough tryout in running over muddy roads, hill-climbing, etc. He went over the Deer Creek hill and back and over the hills on the road leading southward out of town, as well as the North Roseburg and Soldiers' Home hills. He had no trouble in climbing any of them. This machine seems to have solved the problem of an all-the-year-round motor vehicle where muddy roads are to be contended with. Mr. Randle has the agency for all of Western Oregon from Douglas to Multnomah counties, inclusive.

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### GOVERNOR J. FRANK HANLY

In presenting the name of Indiana's great executive, we offer him entirely on his merits as a lecturer—a man with a message. He made no sensational charges, but he fortified his statements with facts which cannot be disputed. He discusses questions of the most momentous importance to the American people at the present time. Governor Hanly recognizes the fact that he has antagonized an influential part of his own party in Indiana by his reform measures but he takes the ground which all holding public office should take, that whatever his party or office requires him to do, that he will do fearlessly and fully without regard to how it may affect him personally or politically. What is needed is more men in office like Governor Hanly in every state in the Union." At the Baptist Church in Roseburg, Friday evening, February 19th, at 8:00, under the auspices of the Roseburg Commercial Club.
