MURDERER FINCH PUTS UP NEW PLEA FOR LIFE.

SALEM, Or., April 20.—The State of Oregon today filed its brief in the case against James A. Finch, convicted of the murder of Ralph Fisher. In reply to the contention of the Appellate Court the verdict and judgment of the lower court are contrary to the constitution of the state, in that it sought to take appellant's life and therefore render reformation impossible. The state's attorney says: "No authorities are cited by the appellant in favor of this contention, and we doubt that any court ever held such a doctrine. It has always been conceded that some persons, and especially assassins, are beyond reformation in this life, and it seems rather strange that it has taken 50 years to make the discovery; that the punishment prescribed by the laws of the State of Oregon for murder in the first degree is unconstitutional."

HIG W. O. W. LOGROLLING AT EUGENE MONDAY.

Eugene Guard: Seven hundred Woodmen of the World, representing nine western Oregon camps, initiated 137 new members into the order at the Woodmen's Hall on Eighth street on Monday evening. In an interview this morning, F. B. Tichenor, general organizer, said that fifty or sixty members of the local order were turned away for want of room.

Of those that were initiated, 57 are Eugene members, the remainder coming from Oakland, Drain, Yoncalla, Cottage Grove, Waiilatpe, Springfield, Creswell and Shedd.

Nobody knew that any but wooden goats were to be used in the ceremony last night. But of the three goats in town, not one would eat a bite this morning. Moreover, the herd that grazes on the hill behind the Masonic cemetery is reported as short a half dozen, but as the owner is a lodge man, he won't make any complaint, unless the goats fail to return tomorrow.

The meeting began last night with the address by Head Consul Boak on "The Good of the Order." Upon the conclusion of the speech the consul presented J. P. Smith, local organizer, with a handsome jewel in recognition of his efforts in the Eugene forest.

Soon after 11 o'clock the real work began. The following officers had charge of the initiations: Consul Commander, I. I. Boak; Advisor, Lieutenant, A. Walker, of Cottage Grove; and Treasurer, Banker, P. E. Snodgrass, Eugene.

Past Consul, Al. Powers, Springfield. Escort, John Veatch, Cottage Grove. Watchman, M. R. Ryan, Drain. Tents which put on the floor work were: Cottage Grove—Captain C. A. Rosenburg; Oakland—Captain L. R. Dunham; Eugene—Captain G. E. Wood. Corps represented—Oakland, Comstock, Drain, Cottage Grove, Eugene, Creswell, Waiilatpe, Springfield and Shedd.

Head officers present were: Head Consul, I. I. Boak; Head Banker, P. E. Snodgrass; General Organizer, F. B. Tichenor. A palatable banquet was served in the lodge rooms after midnight. The three national officers left at noon today for Silverton, where another big log rolling will be held tonight. A special excursion will be run from Salem. Over 100 tickets are already sold.
