### PETITION FAILS TO GET ENOUGH SIGNATURES.

Oregon Agricultural College Appropriation Not to be Submitted to Referendum Vote.

ASHLAND, Or., May 20.—Petitions asking for a referendum vote on the special appropriation bill of the recent legislature granting the Oregon Agricultural College \$210,000 for the construction of new buildings, equipment and purchase of land will not be filed.

E. J. Kaiser, editor of the Valley Record, placed the petitions in circulation throughout the state immediately after the adjournment of the legislature, and was active at the same time in agitating an initiative measure to be voted on by the people placing the University of Oregon, the Agricultural College and the state normals under one board of control. Mr. Kaiser gave out the following statement tonight:

"The petitions do not contain the number of names required. All the names secured were solicited voluntarily, there being no hired solicitors employed."
