PORTLAND IS MADE
ONLY A WAY STATION.

By New Through Train From San Francisco to Seattle Over the S. P. and N. P. Lines.

Portland Journal: The first "benefit" Portland is to receive from the many promised as a result of the agreement between Hill and Harriman over the Pacific northwest business of the one time rival systems is to be made a way station for the only first class train the Southern Pacific has ever operated into Portland.

June 20, the Shasta Limited, a train to be composed entirely of Pullmans, will be placed on the Shasta route. It will run through between San Francisco and Seattle, merely stopping in Portland long enough to let passengers on and off. The train, while operating over the Southern Pacific and the Northern Pacific, will be under the direction of the Union Pacific company, and between East Portland and Seattle will probably be controlled from the office of J. D. Farrell, in Seattle.

This is the fastest train the Southern Pacific has ever operated on its Shasta line. Leaving San Francisco at 6 p. m., it will reach Portland at 9:30 p. m., the following evening and Seattle the second morning. Southbound the train will leave Seattle at 8 a. m., Portland at 6 p. m., and arrive in San Francisco at 9:15 p. m., the following day. None but first class Pullman passengers are to be carried on the train, which is to be made up of Pullman sleepers, standard and compartment, a dining car and an observation car.

Announced in Bay City.
 Official announcement of the Portland-San Francisco time of this train was made by Assistant General Passenger Agent John M. Scott of the Harriman lines this morning. Mr. Scott said he had no official news of the through service to Seattle, but it is known that it is to be inaugurated by the new limited, and announcement of it has already been made in Portland unofficially, and in San Francisco officially.

So far as this train is concerned Portland assumes the same importance as the railroad standpoint as Ashland, the end of the Oregon division, and the beginning of the California division. Trains stop about 20 minutes in Ashland. Because of the bridges and added switching, they may be forced to stop in Portland half an hour. The cars will go on through to Seattle, however, and the new train will be in every respect a solid train between San Francisco and Seattle.

This arrangement was made possible by the agreement recently entered into by Hill and Harriman over the joint use of the Northern Pacific line between Portland and Tacoma by the Union Pacific and the Great Northern. When announcement of the agreement was made by the subsidized Harriman press a long list of the good things that were coming to Portland through the fortunate coalition was printed. The transformation of Portland into a way station by the Harriman lines was not among them but is the first of the many good things to materialize.

Starts This Month.
 The new service will start from San Francisco June 20 and from Seattle June 21, so that the first train southbound from Portland will pass through here June 22. There is to be no change in the leaving time of the two other California bound trains out of Portland and they will continue to leave here at 7:45 p. m., and 1:20 a. m. Northbound, however, No. 14, which now leaves San Francisco at 2:20 p. m., will leave at 11:20 p. m., and reach Portland at 9:50 a. m., instead of 11:15 p. m. No. 16 will leave San Francisco at the same time as at present but will reach Portland at 7:30 instead of 7:15 a. m.

The Roseburg local is to be extended so that it will go through to Ashland, the end of the division and will leave here at 8:15 a. m. This train is for Oregon business only and will have no California connection at Ashland. There will be some slight change in the time of the local from Roseburg to Portland, which has not yet been settled upon.

NICHOLAS READY FOR **JOURNEY TO GERMANY.**

ST. PETERSBURG, June 16.—Emperor Nicholas completed his preparations today for his meeting with Kaiser Wilhelm in the Finnish Gulf tomorrow, which will mark the beginning of a long tour of European capitals which the Czar will undertake this summer. Rumors of plots for the assassination of the Czar during his forthcoming trip are current in St. Petersburg and extraordinary precautions have been taken to prevent such an attempt.

The deepest political significance is attached to the trip of the Russian Emperor.

Though the utmost secrecy so far attends his plans, it is believed that there underlies them a policy designed to place Russia in a wholly new relation with the other world powers.

The meeting which, according to most reports, has been arranged on the initiative of Emperor Nicholas, is taken to mean that Russia prefers an amicable arrangement with Germany to the doubtful issue of an antagonistic policy. If Emperor William also meets President Fallieres, as reported from Berlin, the European situation may be regarded as entering upon a decidedly peaceful phase.

Forty-eight thousand troops will be stationed along the route during the journey.

LOOK OUT FOR SUN'S **ECLIPSE TOMORROW.**

WASHINGTON, June 16.—A spectacle of great interest to the astronomical world will be tomorrow's eclipse of the sun.

The phenomenon will be visible in its totality only in the region near the north pole, but it may be seen in the western part of the United States near sunset and in the eastern part near sunrise through a smoked glass.

The next eclipse of the sun which will be observed in totality in this country will occur June 8, 1918, and will be visible from Oregon to Florida.

According to Professor John A. Brashear, an Allegheny astronomer, tomorrow's eclipse of the sun will be totally unlike any other recorded in the history of sky-seers. He says: "The eclipse will be of a very interesting character from the fact that for a few seconds it will be annular eclipse, then change to a total eclipse, then back to an annular eclipse for the second time. I cannot find record of such an occurrence in any history of astronomy, although we have records of annular eclipses for 400 years, and of total eclipses for thousands of years."
