GRADING IS COMMENCED.

White Men Wanted by Contractors for Street Paving Work.

Although work on the curbing for Roseburg's street paving has been in progress for over a month the actual grading for the paving itself was only commenced this morning. The big steam roller and a considerable force of men are at work on Sheridan street, opposite the depot, and the first two blocks will soon be put into shape to receive the bitulithic surface, as the grading to be done there is comparatively light, and the new street surface will vary very little from its present level.

The superintendent in charge says he is now ready to employ 30 more white men on this construction work. He has only white men employed. The gang reported as being broke, brought here a few days ago, are said to be Bohemians and are to be used only in the rock quarry, north of town. These are said to be experienced quarrymen whose places it is impracticable to fill with a picked up crew who are unaccustomed to handling the explosives used in getting out the rock for use in the paving work. As heretofore announced, the paving company will use only white men on the streets, the only exception to this rule being when it comes to handling the molten bitulithic surfacing, which is poured on while hot, and that is work that very few white men will do, because of the intense heat.

With a crew in the rock quarry and another on the streets, with a large portion of the curbing already in place, Roseburg's street paving work is fairly under way, and will be put through to completion as fast as possible.

LANE COUNTY SLAYER INDICTED, 2ND DEGREE.

EUGENE, Ore., June 20.—William R. Walker, the former Lane County Clerk and hoggrower, who shot and killed Edward Lang in a drunken quarrel in Walker's hopyard several weeks ago, was indicted for murder yesterday afternoon for murder in the second degree, since the killing Walker has been out on bonds. The trial will occur some time next week. Lang and Walker were both intoxicated at the time of the shooting. Lang began to abuse Walker's aged mother, whereupon Walker secured a shotgun and approached Lang. They grappled and during the scuffle the gun was discharged, the birdshot with which the piece was loaded entering Lang's leg. He died from the effects of the wound several days later.
