THROUGH TRAINS OCT. 1.
SAN FRANCISCO, Calif., July 5.—
The Western Pacific Railway will be
completed and ready for operation be-
tween Ogden and Oakland by October
1, according to H. M. McCarty, first
assistant to the chief engineer. The
company has 6000 men at work on
the 200-mile gap that remains to be
closed. McCarty says that there is
not a rolling stock at this end, but that
if cars and engines were provided
trains could be run into the Feather
River country at once.

OLYMPIA, Wash., July 4.—Of the
quarter-million-dollar fire loss here
last night \$100,000 is included as a
loss of business by the National Wood
Pipe Company and Pacific Tank Com-
pany, whose combined plants were
destroyed. These companies have
been lately rushed with orders, call-
ing for about 25 miles of pipe, most
of it stove pipe, for municipal water
systems and irrigation systems. One
contract alone for Medford, Or., was
for 23 miles of 18-inch stove pipe.
Only about half of which has been
delivered. Nearly 6,000 feet of
pipe was consumed in the fire, al-
though several loaded cars were
saved.
