LOCAL NEWS.
 Marshfield Times. W. E. Best left Monday for Roseburg and other Umpqua valley points. G. W. Carleton reports that good progress is being made in collecting for the new railroad and that everybody seems to be willing to help it along. Mr. Carleton says he is well pleased with the spirit that is being shown and is confident that enough money will be surveyed shortly. A letter from Ray Lee, the young Marshfield lad, who accompanied R. M. Boynton with his horses from here, conveys the information that Cossett, the fast mare that was taken sick during the trip from here to Portland, died a few days ago. Cossett was one of the fastest jumpers that ever ran on the Marshfield track and local horsemen will sincerely regret Boynton's loss. E. M. Andrews returned Sunday from Bandon, where he has been looking over the land in regard to oil. When asked today if he thought anything would be done around Bandon in the oil line, Mr. Andrews said that he did not think his company would do anything there. He also said that the company formed to operate in that section last year had gone south so far into Curry county as to be entirely too far out of his territory for investigation. Mr. Andrews reports that everything is progressing nicely and that operations will be commenced as soon as the required amount of land is signed up. Col. Mundy and J. W. Perkins are expected here soon. Alex. Campbell, a well known Coos county man, died at Mercy Hospital Sunday evening, succumbing to a complication of diseases from which he had suffered for the past two years. Mr. Campbell was 32 years old and was born and raised in this section, Henryville being his birthplace. For years he was connected with Libby mine, for five years being foreman of it. He was also connected with the Beaver Hill mines for a time and for some time was engaged in business in Marshfield.
