PITIFUL STORY OF A WOMAN.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 2.—Guided by a letter written to her daughter, the police rescued Mrs. Maria Jose Rancadero from Giuseppe Gioi today, after they had broken down the door of the home of the Italian and struggled with knives and clubs with the enraged Dielo who fought desperately until he was finally subdued and taken to the city prison.

With the Italian handcuffed, the officers searched the house and found Mrs. Rancadero tied hand and foot in the basement. She was unconscious from a beating she had received earlier in the day.

For thirteen months, she alleges, she has been the slave of the man. When taken to the hospital for treatment the woman told a story of suffering beginning with the departure of her husband, over a year ago, for the east to procure work.

Before leaving he entrusted Mrs. Rancadero and his four children to Gioi. He promised to see that they wanted for nothing. As soon as her husband left, she asserted, Gioi compelled her to leave her children in charge of a family in San Jose and began life with him in a hovel on Proletas avenue.

He kept her there a prisoner, she said. She escaped three times and each time was caught and taken back to her life of slavery. Then the woman attempted communication with her children by means of letters, but Gioi intercepted all the missives except one, which reached the 13-year-old daughter at San Jose, and the police were notified.

When they approached the doorway and demanded entrance Gioi waited inside with a stiletto. When the authorities smashed the door open he sprang savagely at them.

ENGINEERING NOTES.

Scientific American: Some details have lately been made public of the instrumental work on the Gunnison tunnel, recently completed by the government, which will bring some 200,000 acres of land under cultivation. The tunnel, from entrance to entrance is six miles in length. The survey lines at the point of meeting differed 0.32 foot in level, 0.94 foot in alignment and 0.86 foot in distance.

Rumor has it that another long step forward has been made in the art of armor plate manufacture. It is stated that the new plate, which is fabricated from a steel alloy, combines great toughness with extreme hardness of face, and that in a recent test a 6-inch plate stopped a 9-inch capped explosive shell. We doubt it; but if it was done, the new armor must be even more superior to Krupp armor than Krupp armor is to that made under the old Harvey patents.

During the month of June the total excavation on the Panama canal was 2,895,793 cubic yards, which is slightly less than the total for the month of May. The mean rainfall was 11.85 inches for the month as compared with 9.82 inches in May. There were 366,998 cubic yards of material placed in the Gatun Dam, and 10,668 cubic yards of concrete were laid in the floor of the spillway.

The advantage of having the White Star Line steamers call at Holyhead was shown on a recent trip of the "Cedric," when mails and passengers were landed at 1:30 p. m. and reached London at 7:15 p. m. Those passengers who went on to Liverpool were not disembarked until 10 p. m., being detained by the state of the tide in the Mersey. The passengers who landed at Holyhead, therefore, reached London three hours before their fellow passengers were landed in Liverpool.

Much has been said of late years about the case with which a lock can be destroyed by the malicious use of dynamite or other high explosives. Engineering News calls attention to the fact that an attempt made in 1900 to wreck the Welland Canal in this way produced surprisingly small results. After two weeks' examination, the two men concerned selected lock 24, and each lowered a watch containing dynamite and a fuse to the water behind the gate at each end of the lock. Both charges were exploded; but the dynamite failed to carry away the gates. Although the explosives blew a hole about a foot in diameter through each gate and loosened the hinges, the gates remained in position, holding back the water.

SALMON FILLING THE SOUND.

140,000 Taken From Traps—10,000 Cases Put Up.

BELLINGHAM, Wash., Aug. 12.—So heavy has the salmon run become that no attempt will be made by the canners to pack the "humpback" salmon that are now being received, and in order to dispose of this species the management of the Pacific American Fisheries Company is today importing the public to take them away. Every man, woman and child applying at the cannery will be given fish in any number from one to one thousand. Scow loads of these fish have been towed to the Pacific American dock and a man placed there to pass them out to applicants.

Tuesday the company made the biggest pack in the history of the plant, a total of 10,000 cases being put up during the day. A total of 140,000 salmon were taken from the Alsea traps yesterday.
