INSANE TRANSIENT HAS RACE WITH DEVIL.

Disturbs Travel on Deer Creek Road and Discards Footwear in Effort to Escape.

Wildly insane from the effects of a two weeks' battle with John Barleycorn, W. M. Cooney, a transient, did a Marathon stunt on the Deer Creek road, east of Roseburg, this morning, in an attempt to distance the Devil, who kept persistently at his heels. "You're my meat, and I'll get you," Cooney says he heard the gentleman with the cloven hoofs remark.

In order to increase his speed, Cooney discarded his shoes and socks, also his hat, but no matter how fast he hiked the fellow with the trident was on the job like a jackrabbit. When D. W. Hunter, a South Deer Creek farmer, came along with his team and wagon, enroute home, Cooney attempted to grab the bridle of one of the horses, but Mr. Hunter quickly reined his team to one side of the road and then drove out of the maniac's reach. Cooney then turned back toward town, and when a young man named Hatfield came along on horseback he tried to leap up behind him. After a brief tussle, Hatfield shook the fellow loose and sped away.

When Cooney reached a point near the Odd Fellows' cemetery he was met by Sheriff Fenton and submitted quietly, his mania having passed off almost entirely. While warning his mad enveloped feet and chilled body before the stove in Sheriff Fenton's office, Cooney appeared rational and fully realized what he had experienced. He acknowledged himself to be a slave to drink and said that he had an attack of delirium tremens three years ago in St. Louis, where he was employed by the Simmons Hardware Company. Of late he has been working on the Government reclamation project in the Yakima Valley, Washington.

Cooney is apparently not over 30 years of age. He drifted into town yesterday and last night slept in a barn on the Gaddis place. Early this morning the effects of alcoholism began telling on him. He will be sent on his way as soon as he is able to travel.
