Plans for a national Audubon university on the University Settlement plan, to be endowed with \$1,000,000, have been announced in New York. Based on the known annual crop loss of \$1,000,000,000, due to the spreading pests that the insect-eating birds destroy, the calculations of the National Association of Audubon Societies, which is back of this project, shows that the teaching of bird value from such an institution must result in wiping out at least one per cent of the huge national penalty for popular lack of knowledge on this subject. For every hundred thousand dollars put into this work of economic education a million is sure to be saved to the agricultural interests of the whole people. Successful agriculture means general prosperity, and thus every merchant, manufacturer and business man of any sort is vitally interested and should bear his part in the plan to educate the public in the great economic principles of bird conservation.
