### BLIND JUSTICE GIVES BANK WRECKER LIBERTY.

CHICAGO, Jan. 20.—Paul O. Stensland, ex-president of the Milwaukee Avenue State Bank of Chicago, and Henry W. Hering, formerly its cashier, who were convicted in connection with the wrecking of the bank and the disappearance of \$1,300,000 of its funds, were pardoned today by the board of pardons.

Stensland, who was captured after a sensational chase across the Atlantic Ocean, into Europe, and to Morocco, has served three years, three months and 24 days. He is nearly 63 years old.

Allowing for good behavior his time represents a sentence of four years, six months and eight days. He was sent to the penitentiary on an indictment sentence of from one to ten years.

The looting of the Milwaukee Avenue State Bank involved the savings of 22,000 depositors, mostly small tradesmen and wage earners. The suicide of the bank's paying teller and of three ruined depositors, the death of another from worry, and four victims adjudged insane from the same cause added an element of tragedy to the affair.
