Portland Journal: Roseburg offers many inducements to the vacationist. The town lies prettily on the hill side, the Umpqua river flowing gently at its base. Here are repeated such outing opportunities as are to be had at Albany and Eugene—a railway center between coast and mountains, with rivers to ascend, and lakes to explore. You can follow the Coquille to the coast, or take the daily Marshfield stage to Coos Bay, either way affording fishing—20 inch trout being common, and the limit, 150 a day, often reached. You can secure guides and go 24 miles east of Roseburg to the North Umpqua into a famous deer country, and following on up stream, partly by road and trail, reach Diamond Lake, from which point the trail leads to Mt. Thielsen and Crater Lake.

lowering of the flag seems to be the principal occupation of the service. Again, in the afternoon, in addressing 1000 people in the court house grounds in Klamath Falls, he said:

Government Incompetence.
"You have both the Forestry Service and the Reclamation Service represented here, and therefore I know you have a good country, for wherever there is new country that could be developed, there you will find the Government reserving something. The Reclamation men who are on the ground here are perhaps good men. I believe they are. But the fault lies higher up. There is incompetency in the direction of the service."

Mr. Hill advised the people of Klamath Falls, however, that as long as the Government had undertaken reclamation work here, it was wisdom for the people to use the water and develop the country.

Similar criticisms were made of the Forest Service and Reclamation Service at Lakeview. The administration of Western forests, he charged, was put in the hands of young college men from the East, who knew nothing of Western conditions. There Mr. Hill was followed by William Hanley, who endorsed Mr. Hill's remarks.

In numerous conversations with the farmers and business men of Interior Oregon, Mr. Hill has expressed views antagonistic to Pinchotism, and has a big fund of illustrations to draw from of the locking up of Montana by Government bureaus.

Everywhere these expressions of opinion have been received with applause by his auditors, and the residents have come forward with incidents of the holding back of settlement on Government land and hindrances, particularly by the Forest Bureau, to the development of the country.

U. OF O. TRACK TEAM BEATS O. A. C. 84 TO 38.

EUGENE, Or., May 29.—By a crushing score of 84 to 38, on a fast track and favored by almost perfect weather conditions, the University of Oregon overwhelmed Oregon Agricultural College in the annual track meet between the two institutions here today.

Martin Hawkins, Oregon's speedy hurdler, tied a coast record in the 120-yard high hurdles, when he ran it in the fast time of 15 2-5 seconds. After winning from Burdick and Olson, of O. A. C., in the pole vault at 10 feet 6 inches, Williams of Oregon established a new Northwest

mark by clearing the bar at 12.2 feet.

By winning the mile relay in the remarkable time of 3:27 2-5, "Bill" Hayward's athletes captured another Northwest record. This broke Washington's time of 3:29 4-5, made in the Oregon-Washington-Idaho meet in Seattle. Oregon's winning team was composed of Kay, Elliott, Johns and McDaniels; and the O. A. C. entered Thompson, Selmans, Shadduck and Castle.

McClure, a freshman, won the mile in 4:35 4-5, a college record, and Johns won the quarter-mile in 51 1-5 seconds, tying a college record.

O. A. C. won only four firsts to ten for Oregon.

Bergman won the 100-yard dash in 10 1-5; Enberg, of O. A. C., captured the discus, and Hawley, Shattuck and Niekerson, all of O. A. C., took every place in the high jump. Bergman was the "Aggies" star and biggest point-winner with 9 points. Kellogg took 13 points for Oregon.
