OVER 100 CHILDREN IN IDAHO HAVE MYELITIS.

LEWISTON, Idaho, July 19.—More than 100 cases of a new disease, manifesting the predominant symptoms of infantile paralysis, meningitis and tetanus are reported among the children of the Camas and Nez Perce prairies, and three deaths have already resulted. Physicians frankly admit their inability to cope with the malady, and confess they are at a loss to explain its origin. The disease is confined principally to children under 6 years of age, but when the older ones are attacked the results are much more severe. It is spreading with alarming rapidity, and the whole district affected is almost panic stricken, many families removing their children to other localities until the epidemic has subsided.
