CIVIL WAR IN IRELAND LIKELY TO COME SOON.

LONDON, Dec. 20.—A crisis in Ulster as a result of the return of the Liberal party to power is indicated in dispatches received from Ireland today. The opponents of home rule for Ireland as part of the liberal program for the coming parliament have subscribed \$50,000 for warlike measures.
