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AUTOMOBILE SHOW WILL BE GREATEST EXHIBITION.
 Whole Week of Novel Program in Portland in Which Marvel Cars Will be Seen.

PORTLAND, Jan. 20.—One of the most novel automobile exhibits ever held on the Pacific Coast is to be held in Portland during the week between Saturday, January 21, and Saturday, January 28. Portland automobile dealers are to hold open house during that week and every man, woman and child is invited to visit the various garages and see the new models on exhibition here.

During the week there will be "stunts" that will keep every day in the minds of the people. Saturday will be featured by the Journal's big reliability run for commercial trucks and also opening night. Monday there will be a parade which promises to be the largest that has ever been held in the Northwest. Tuesday a number of specialties the nature of which has been kept a secret will be pulled off, while Wednesday will be society night. Thursday there will be slow and obstacle races, the like of which have never been held here before. Friday will be truck day and the big commercial motor trucks will be put through their steps for the edification of the merchants and others interested. Saturday will end the grand finale and will be the occasion of a real feast for the dealers and their friends.

Besides these features for the public at large, the automobile dealers themselves will hold a convention lasting all week. The out-of-town dealers from every section of the state, attracted by special rates on the railroads, are planning on coming to the city, and at least 2000 automobile admirers and hardware men will be in attendance at this convention. The Oregon State Hardware & Implement Dealers are to hold their annual convention during that week and they will be invited to attend the opening convention of the automobile dealers in a body.

The plan adopted by the Portland Automobile Dealers' Association for this opening week is to do away with

the automobile show which has been held previous to this year. The dealers have far outgrown the arena in which their shows have been held, that this building, the largest in the city, was absolutely impracticable for the show. Wanting to show their wares to the public in the best way possible the dealers have hit upon this plan and are putting it into effect.

The show rooms of the dealers, attractively decorated, are to be opened to the public from 2 o'clock each afternoon until 10 o'clock in the evening. Many of the dealers are planning on individual decorations and little attractions which are bound to make the plan successful in that they will draw the people to their exhibits. The opening week has been advertised extensively throughout the state, and besides the large number of automobile men who will attend, a large number of people will likely take advantage of the one and a third round trip fare to visit Portland.

One of the most complete systems of transferring the guests of the dealers' association from one garage to another on the show nights has been adopted. A line of over 200 automobiles will carry passengers from one district to another. BREEDING BUGS TO DESTROY INSECT PESTS.

The California state insectary, which has been of such great help to farmers, gardeners and fruit men of the state, is described in an interesting illustrated article in the February Popular Mechanics Magazine. The institution collects, breeds and distributes beneficial insects upon a scale never attempted anywhere else in the world. The breeding of beneficial insects is really a less complicated matter than might be supposed. All that is necessary is a few specimens of the insect and an abundant supply of its appropriate food. Then if the right conditions of heat, light and ventilation are supplied, the enormous reproductive powers of the insects may be trusted to take care of the rest.

The scientists in charge of the insectary keep the eggs, larvae and matured insects of all known beneficial species of importance in the state in "cold storage," that is to say, at a temperature that will keep them dormant without injuring their vitality. Whenever a serious outbreak of any pest insect is reported in any part of the state the first thing necessary at the insectary is to secure pest-infected leaves, twigs or fruit. These are placed in breeding cages along with the beneficial insect known to be the natural enemy of that particular pest, and the temperature regulated to the proper degree for insect development. The beneficial insects at once become active; and, finding an abundance of their appropriate food they multiply with great rapidity. Within a few days after receiving notice of the outbreak of the pest, the parasitologists of the insectary are ready to ship colonies numbering thousands of the insect which is best calculated to bring the pest under subjection.


