The annual meeting of the stockholders of the Citizens' State Bank was held last week. S. S. Johns, John Hall, C. O. Nelson and J. R. Lasswell were re-elected directors and the board was organized by electing John Hall president, J. R. Lasswell, vice president and C. O. Nelson cashier. Since the present officers took control of the bank last June the business has increased very materially, deposits last January being \$32,000, and their official statement on January 7 of this year, as called for by the bank commissioners, shows \$32,000.

DRAIN NEWS.

Mrs. Minnie Welmer, wife of Lonsen Welmer, and niece of Mr. and Mrs. Dwight Reed, of this city died of typhoid fever on Wednesday last at Ashland.

On Wednesday evening the bridge spanning Pass Creek on a street and leading to East Drain, was struck by a heavy south wind and completely demolished. It was a structure about 40 feet in length and covered by a heavy roofing, and has not been considered altogether safe for some time.

The Churchill-Mathews Company, of Portland, has begun shipping trees to their lands at Tin Poi, and soon an army of men will be needed to set them out. A carload of these trees has arrived here, in which there are 15,000 trees, and they are being hauled to the ground in spite of the bad roads. In addition to this some 30,000 additional trees will arrive, making 45,000 in all to be planted.—Nonpareil.

The people of Oregon do not know how near they came to losing their new Governor. Oswald West was on the list for appointment to the Interstate Commerce Commission. He refused to consider the matter, saying that his duty was to serve the people of Oregon for four years as Governor. However, his achievements as State Land Agent and State Railroad Commissioner had attracted attention the country over, and, inasmuch as Commissioner Cockrell, of Missouri, a Democrat, was not to be re-appointed, Mr. West could have had the position, had he consented to accept it.—J. E. Lathrop, in Pacific Monthly.

Sutherland Sun: A co-partnership was recently formed between County School Superintendent Thurman Chaney, S. F. Lason, H. S. Klepping, and J. A. Acheson for the purpose of compiling, editing, printing and selling upon the market a series of supplementary text books and advertising novelties. The first of the series is now in press and will be ready for sale February 1st. It consists of a comprehensive work on the State and National civics government by the county superintendent and Prof. Lason, so arranged that each day's questions and answers are given covering the entire course in civics. It also includes the constitution of Oregon and an address on civic procedure adapted to the needs of all our citizens.

SOCIALIST GOES TO JAIL FOR CURSING TAFT.

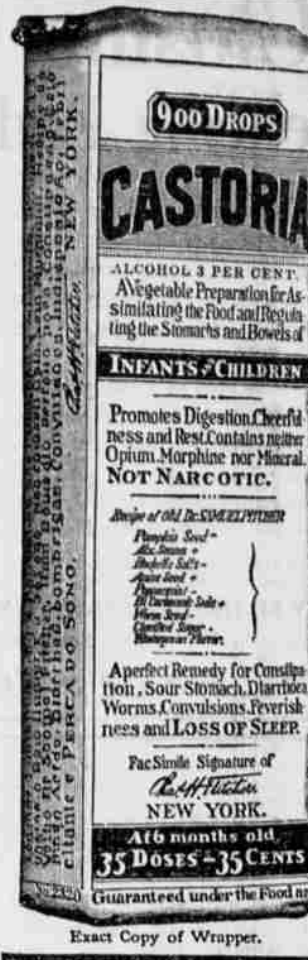
