PORTLANDERS PLEASED WITH RECEPTION HERE.

Portland Telegram: Unstinted hospitality that would have done credit to a community ten times its size was showered upon the visiting guests of Roseburg at its third annual Strawberry and Rose Carnival, which opened yesterday. Every man, woman and child seemed to have been imbued with one idea—to give the stranger a good time, make him glad he came and anxious to go again. So, at least, the 175 Portlanders felt as they started home last night with a farewell flourish of applause at the handsome Elks' Club.

Roseburg's ability to make such an elegant showing with such an impromptu of visitors is due principally to the fact that all her citizens are boosters and worked shoulder to shoulder to get ready. They stayed right on the job all through the day that was jammed full of novel and interesting features of entertainment and fun, from brilliant decorated parades to fishing trips, sight seeing rides to an old-fashioned informal dance with the pink-checked bellows and matrons of Roseburg.

What the season, because of its backwardness, lacked in strawberries and roses, it made up in the true carnival spirit, in decorations, in beautiful women gaily attired and in spontaneous good-fellowship, all hands around. In the element of putting up a fine front, Roseburg had dressed up her streets, buildings, store fronts and even residences on a scale of magnitude and beauty that probably has not been surpassed by any city in Oregon comparable in size. Her main business street was a shimmering vista of lively colors from end to end, and would have

done credit to a Portland business thoroughfare during Rose Festival time, and some of the floats in the decorated parade were artistic gems. Roseburg has nearly 100 automobiles, owned either in the city or in the immediate vicinity, and these cars were kept busy all day taking the Portland visitors for trips all through the great fertile Umpqua Valley and its tributary garden spots.

One of the things that impressed the guests, aside from the beauty of scenery, progressiveness of the agricultural population, and fine opportunities presented in all lines of development was the excellent highways that serve as arteries for the rapidly increasing tonnage originating in the surrounding valleys, and for which Roseburg is the natural assembling and transshipping point.

The Portlanders were given a two-fold opportunity for studying the possibilities of the Umpqua Valley at close range. First, the 40-mile tour by automobile took the visitors through farms, orchards and broad stretches of gardens and even up to the hills from which emanates the whole valley lay spread out before them in a picturesque panorama of velvety verdure and growing crops. Then a comprehensive display of the products of that section had been prepared by the local "Grange" and farmers, and showed exactly what had been done under systematic and scientific culture.

One of the greatest treats was the privilege extended the Portland delegation of trolling for trout in the Umpqua River, which literally is alive with these game specimens of the fluvial domain. Some of the visitors had great luck, and many messes of fine fish were brought back to Portland on the special train, which returned home this morning. Monster Chinook salmon were also among the trophies of the angling parties, catches ranging in weight from 30 up to 62 pounds to the fish.

Last evening at the informal reception at the Commercial Club and the final love-feast and luncheon at "Mrs. Tombs" it seemed as if the whole county had turned out to greet the guests.

Aside from the festival features of the occasion, Portland business men, manufacturers, jobbers and others who enjoy trade relations with the Roseburg territory, took advantage of the opportunity to make a thorough investigation of business conditions in that field and it was the unanimous verdict of the representatives of Portland mercantile houses that the Umpqua Valley furnishes a field for exploitation far beyond their previous estimates, and that the community is one of the thriftiest and most up to date sections of the state with which Portland has any trade relations.

In return for the fine support given by Portland, Roseburg will send a big delegation to the Rose Festival. The Commercial Club there is arranging to conduct an overland automobile tour to the Rose City, in which fully 50 cars will take part in the 200-mile run. In addition to this hundreds of people not owning automobiles will come up on the train and spend several days here during the week. Frank E. Alley, of the Bonaday Stock Farm, will enter his crack coaching outfit with his well-matched four-hand team in the horse and carriage parade. This elegant turn-out is the finest in that part of the state and was one of the features of yesterday's parade.

Roseburg Pledges Portland Aid for Auditorium.

Roseburg has led all state communities in support of the Portland auditorium plan, giving an outline of one of the most ambitious festival projects in commemoration of the work that has ever been held in the state. Should Portland build an auditorium, Roseburg proposes to hold in the structure as soon as it shall be available, a National strawberry festival and rose show, when the whole city of Roseburg will come to Portland.

In a telegram received by Postmaster Merriek, chairman of the auditorium committee of the Commercial Club, yesterday afternoon, R. E. Smith, vice president of the Roseburg Commercial Club, makes the following statement:

"Roseburg citizens hope Portland will build the city auditorium, as we propose to hold a National strawberry festival and rose show at Portland as soon as it is opened. Five thousand Roseburg citizens will attend to make it a success."

Coming voluntarily from the state, and suggesting only one of the points of advantage accruing to the city from having a great auditorium here, this telegram from Roseburg is one of the most cheering events developing since the convention committee began its labors.
