UNDESERVED HUMILIATION.

Eugene Guard: The threatened recall of Judge Coke of this district is much to be regretted. There is no evidence that he has been derelict in his duty, or intentionally biased in his rulings from the bench. A murder trial at Roseburg, however, resulted in an acquittal when many persons thought the defendant should have been punished in some degree, and exceptions are taken to the instructions given the jury by Judge Coke. Careful examination of these instructions fails to disclose wherein the court deviated from the rules of law in such cases, but after the verdict of acquittal it seemed necessary to criticize some one and fix the blame somewhere, and it was discovered that the instructions were not worded in accordance with those asked for by the district attorney through the office of the same import. Judge Coke is in reality being humiliated as an expression of popular feeling against lax enforcement of criminal law. It is asserted, also, that violators of the local option law who were heavily fined by the court are taking advantage of the situation for purposes of revenge.

The danger of putting the recall into effect against the judiciary becomes apparent once we confront a condition such as obtains in this instance. It has been argued with apparent good reason that the election of judges for short terms reduces the

occupant of the bench in this country to the level of the common office-seeker. This may be an extreme view, but we can easily realize how the menace of the recall will tend toward making trimmers of the weaker class of judges. They will be more intent upon making popular decisions than in weighing the law and evidence and rendering a decision in accordance with it.

In the case in point, Judge Coke has made a really enviable record upon the bench. He is a hardworking man, of good legal ability and known to those who are closest to him as honest and sincere. Even if the recall movement does not progress to the point of an election the action taken has been humiliating from its inception, implying a distrust, and censure that is wholly undeserved.

Recall Sure to Fail.
Portland Journal: Probably if the recall be invoked against Judge Coke, the matter will go to the Supreme Court. It ought to.

Then, the issue presented to the higher tribunal will be, why is the recall invoked in this instance? The reply will be that the recall is invoked because Judge Coke gave certain instructions to the jury in a certain case.

If the court finds the instructions to be correct, what can it do, but declare the recall on Judge Coke unwarranted? If it finds the instruc-

tions incorrect, what can it do but declare that under the constitution there is no way but by judicial process for the error to be righted? In either event, how can the high court, being guided by the constitution, hold that a judge is recallable for interpreting the law according to his light and ability?

If the higher court does not take such a view, what day will it be recalled for its interpretation of the law? If it can be recalled on such a pretext, then there is no constitutionally created judiciary with power and authority to administer justice. The effect would be to break down that part of the state constitution which makes the judiciary a coordinate branch of a government consisting of the legislative, executive and judicial departments. It is impossible under our system to make the people the Supreme court. Yet that is exactly what is being attempted by those who are proposing to invoke the recall on a judge because of his interpretation of the law. The Coke recall will fail because neither the recall nor the constitution ever contemplated that every man in Oregon is a supreme judge.

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OREGON NEWS.

What is held to be the tallest one-pole flag pole in the world has been presented to the Astoria Centennial by a Portland lumber company. The staff is 219 feet 5 inches tall, 36 inches in diameter at the butt and 15 inches at the top. The stick is yellow fir, without a single defect, and was found in the woods of Clatsop County. The giant flagpole will be set up in the city park at Astoria and Phil Metcham, of Portland, has presented a huge flag to the Centennial management to fly from this staff. The banner is 50 feet long and 25 feet wide. The pole and flag have arrived at Astoria and a foundation of cement is now being made in which to set the big stick.

A parrot belonging to John P. Shoup, a Civil War veteran living at Oregon City, summoned aid when his master was helpless from a paralytic stroke. Mr. Shoup lived alone and early in the morning was stricken, his entire left side being affected. He was unable to call for assistance. The parrot, hearing his moans, set up a loud screeching that attracted the attention of passersby and they entered the house to find Mr. Shoup, who is 74 years old, helpless. He was taken to a hospital and cared for and will probably recover.

According to the Oregonian's estimate of the wheat crop, this year's yield will be a record in the three states of Oregon, Washington and Idaho. The prediction is made that

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the crop will total 55,000,000 bushels, the biggest since 1908, when the wheat yield of the Pacific Northwest amounted to 60,000,000 bushels. With the exception of a few districts, where more rain is needed, the whole wheat growing area of the Pacific Northwest is in fine shape and a splendid crop is practically assured. It is safe to say the yield of the three states will be far in excess of last year, when 42,500,000 bushels was harvested.
