He began the growing of strawberries, but after he had raised his berries there was no agency through which to ship the fruit from Hood River, so he began at once to find a market for the fruit that he and his neighbors had grown. Mr. Davidson was thus the first shipper of strawberries from Hood River, and from that time on he devoted his time to the shipment of berries and apples, and this effort was

the foundation of the Davidson Fruit Company, one of the largest private concerns shipping on the Coast. This company, of which Mr. Davidson is the head, bought the entire output of Hood River apples a few years ago. Mr. Davidson has recently owned the water plant and electric light plant of the city, and has at present several hundred acres of orchard lands.
