NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

Sealed proposals will be received by the undersigned up to 12 o'clock (noon) of March 27th, 1912, for the furnishing of all labor and materials, and the erection of a school building, to be erected on the school site (Block No. 19, Kinney's Improved Plat to City of) Roseburg, Oregon, according to the plans and specifications prepared by Joseph W. Dow, Architect, Rooms 3 and 4, Roseburg National Bank building, Roseburg, Oregon. Plans and specifications of same can be seen at the office of the School Board, Roseburg, Oregon, and also at the office of said architect, on and after March 8th, 1912.

Contractors desiring plans are required to deposit Fifteen (\$15.00) Dollars, made payable to Joseph W. Dow, Architect, for the privilege of retaining plans from office for nine (9) days. Said amount to be forfeited to architect should parties fail to return plans before that time. All plans shall be returned to Architect or School Board on or before date of letting, or bids will not be considered.

Blank forms of proposals are attached to specifications and must be followed by contractors bidding on this work, and the proposal must be addressed to George Neuner, Jr., Secretary of School Board, District No. 4, Roseburg, Oregon, and plainly marked "Proposal for School Building," and must be accompanied by a certified check in an amount equal to five (5) per cent of the bid, and made payable to George Neuner, Jr., Secretary of School Board, Roseburg, Oregon. This deposit will be returned to the bidders, whose bids are rejected, and to the successful bidder upon his entering into a contract with said School Board, in accordance with his bid and giving a satisfactory bond (security) in the sum of the full amount of the contract, which contract and bond shall be entered into within six (6) days after the notification that his bid has been accepted.

Should the bidder fail to enter into such contract and bond, said deposit shall be forfeited to the School District.

The Board reserves the right to reject any and all bids, and to waive any informality in the same, if it is deemed for the best interests of the district to do so.

THE L. W. W. BELIEVE IN NOTHING AND ARE AGAINST EVERYTHING.

Representative of the Organization Speaks Before Church Brotherhood.

The Eugene Guard is in receipt of a copy of "Greetings," a Baptist publication issued in San Diego, Cal., of the issue of February 25, brought from there by J. M. Shelley, which contains a remarkable statement of the principles of the L. W. W. as set forth by one of its members at a meeting of the Baptist Brotherhood in that city.

The report as contained in "Greetings" is as follows:

"The meeting of the Brotherhood last Monday evening was perhaps the most remarkable meeting ever held in a Christian church. Without announcement (save that all men were urged to be present, the program being called a surprise) a representative of the Industrial Workers of the World—the men who are making such a stir in police courts—was invited to make a statement of the principles and purposes of the L. W. W. It was our desire to get knowledge at first hand. The agreement was to give him 30 minutes, during which time he was to have full liberty of utterance, to be followed by 15 minutes of questions. His position, his statements, his claims, were the most astounding utterances ever falling from human lips into the ears of Christian men and loyal citizens of the United States. It is not possible to reproduce the utterances here, but a few sentences will indicate the trend of the address. The speaker was a Mr. White, introduced to us as a representative of the L. W. W. Among other things he said: 'We are opposed to the existing order; we are against it from the bottom up. We do not respect the laws or the flag of the United States. It is a symbol of oppression; we have no respect for it whatever. It floats over the vilest places, and has no message for us. We do not believe in the existing laws of the country. We do not believe in the system of wages. We propose to overthrow the whole system, and give every man a chance. We do not believe in a God. We do not worship God. The preaching of the gospel of Jesus Christ has been the greatest curse of the world, because it teaches submission to the present order, promising something better in the near future of life.' There are some of the startling sentences used by the representative of the L. W. W. Since they were given in a representative capacity, publicly, there can be no impropriety in printing them. At the close of the address, Dr. Geistweil asked the following questions, in order to definitely understand the speaker, since there was no desire to misrepresent the L. W. W.'s or the speaker himself. This is not a stenographic report—but those who were present will doubtless verify the language:

Dr. Geistweil—I understand you to say that the L. W. W. do not believe in God.

Mr. White—We do not.

Dr. G.—You do not worship God?

Mr. W.—We do not.

Dr. G.—I understand you to say that the preaching of Jesus Christ has been the greatest curse upon the world?

Mr. W.—Yes, sir.

Dr. G.—Then you are atheists?

Mr. W.—Yes, sir.

Dr. G.—How often have you been in church in a year?

Mr. W.—Not at all.

Dr. G.—How often in five—in 10 years?

Mr. W.—Perhaps a dozen times—well, I admit I am not a church going man.

Dr. G.—Then how do you know what the preaching of the gospel is?

Mr. W.—I ought to know—I've heard it on the streets.

Dr. G.—But the fact is you are condemning the preaching of the gospel without knowing what it is?

Mr. W.—No answer.

Dr. G.—I understand you to say that you do not believe in the laws of this country, or the constitution of the United States?

Mr. W.—We do not.

Dr. G.—Do you mean to say that you do not believe in obeying the laws of the land?

Mr. W.—Only those I make myself.

Dr. G.—Then you would break all the rest?

Mr. W.—I do not interfere with the rights of others.

Dr. G.—You have no respect for the flag, or for the laws of the country in which you live?

Mr. W.—No, sir.

Dr. G.—Then you are an anarchist?

Mr. W.—Yes, sir.

Dr. Geistweil will consider the whole question next Sunday evening. He announces his subject in this manner: 'Why the Industrial Workers of the World Will Fail.'
